


Join Us in Welcoming Dr. Melissa Schneider, Parkway's Future Superintendent

Three teams from Central High and Spark! greatly impressed a group of engineers at the eighth annual Gateway Arch National Park Engineering Contest with their knowledge, precision, and professionalism. This year, the challenge for our aspiring engineers was to design a pedestrian bridge connecting the park's north overlook to the historic 150-year-old Eads Bridge.

Tony Gilpin of the National Park Service commended Keri Hohl and Brandon Franck's outstanding leadership and Parkway Schools for producing some of the best students in their contest.

He also noted that the judges, who are retired from or currently in the engineering field, marvel at the high school students, who produce executive summaries better than they sometimes see from existing companies.
