Life after PCH

- What is your plan?
- PCH Matriculation Last Year:
 - 4 year College (78%)
 - In-state = 62%
 - Out-of-state/country = 38%
 - Private colleges = 25%
 - Public colleges = 75%
 - 2 year College (15%)
 - Gap Year (2%)
 - Military (2%)
 - Employment or Other (3%)



Phases of Transition to College

- Research
- Apply
 - Complete and submit applications
 - Request transcripts
 - Send official test scores
 - Make arrangements for other required materials (recommendation letters and/or forms)
- Assess finances and funding options
 - Complete the FAFSA (and CSS Profile, if necessary) → October
 - Submit scholarship applications → Ongoing
- Wait for decisions...
- Evaluate all options available
- Final decision made → May 1
- Campus orientations → Summer



What colleges will use to make admissions decisions



Application

- Submit Online keep track of your username/passwords!
- Fees (\$0-\$75+)
 - Waivers available for qualifying students see counselor
- Watch priority and established deadlines
 - For both admission and scholarship consideration
- Choose an application option
- Proofread before submitting. Spell-check isn't enough!

How Many Applications?

- Reach school credentials may meet or are below published admission standards. (All "highly selective" schools should be considered a reach school for every student.)
- <u>Target school</u> credentials are in published range
- Academic safety credentials definitely meet or exceed published standards for the school
- Financial safety school is an academic safety and meets your financial situation
- If you are planning appropriately, you should not need to apply to more than 7-8 schools.

Type of Application?

- School specific apps (Kansas, Illinois, Texas, UC system)
- Common App (800+ schools)
- Coalition App (140+ schools) still new/growing
- Multiple options (Mizzou, Indiana, Bradley, Truman)
 - YOU MUST INDICATE IN NAVIANCE IF YOU ARE USING CA OR NOT!
 - "Not" means your are applying "Direct to the Institution"

Application Deadlines

- Early Decision
 - Sign contract that you will enroll if admitted
- Restrictive Early Action
 - Non-binding, but guidelines for applying early elsewhere
- Early Action (No contract/commitment!)
- Regular Decision
- Rolling Admission/"Priority" Deadlines
 - Ensure you are meeting scholarship deadlines

Submitting Applications


- As soon as your application is complete and accurate, feel free to submit!
- Your transcript and recommendation letters do not have to be submitted for you to submit your application.
- Do not wait until the deadline date (Nov 1) to submit - - give yourself cushion!




- Mark sure you use the email address that you chose for your Common App account



Sending Transcripts

Transcript


- Level of success after 6 semesters
- GPA (weighted, recalculated, core only)
- Rank Parkway does not rank! (0 out of 0)
- Course selection meet requirements by May
- Rigor (AP, dual credit)
- Senior year counts!
 - Maintaining rigor, level of success, and fulfilling admission requirements
 - WashU wants 6 week grades if you apply Early Decision ⊕




- Midyear grades (January)Final transcript (May)

Requesting Transcripts

- Step 1: Turn in the "green sheet" (Authorization to Release Records)
 - make sure you waived your FERPA rights to view letters/forms
- Step 2: Request transcripts in Naviance

Step 3: Wait for processing

- Transcript requests are processed within 3 <u>SCHOOL</u> days if all required supplemental documents are ready for submission.
 - Transcript to non-Common App school - will be sent within 3 school days
 - Transcript to Common App school - will be sent once the Common App School Report has been completed by a counselor
 - Transcript to Common App school requiring teacher and/or counselor recommendation forms/letters - - will be sent once all recommendation letters have been uploaded
 - As long as you have requested at least 3 school days prior to a deadline, your documents will be submitted by the deadline
 - NOTE: We do not have ANY school days during Winter Break!!!


Sending Test Scores

Sending Test Scores

- If the college will accept test scores from PCH as official, you may request them to be included with your transcript. Note: Your entire test card will be submitted.
 - MO State, Maryville, Bradley, Lindenwood, STLCC
- If the college requires score be sent directly from the testing agency, you must log in to ACT and/or College Board and pay to send your scores (\$13).
 - This takes 2-3 weeks, so order WELL before the deadline!!!!
 - If a college "superscores," you have to send all of the scores that are needed to create the highest composite.

Use for admissions/scholarship applications

Recommendation Letters

- Current perspectives (11th or 12th gr teachers)
- Speak of character, academic achievements and potential for collegiate success and community engagement
- Core teacher(s)
- Ask in person don't just email request in Naviance
 - Follow up as deadlines approach
- Outside/additional recommenders
 - Coaches, research mentors, community leaders, employers
- Give at least 3 weeks notice (provide reminders)
- FERPA colleges want to know that the letters have remained confidential
- Write thank you notes and give updates on status

Sending Teacher Recommendations

- Step 1: Sign FERPA waiver (on Common App and on your green sheet)
 - When you apply to a college which requires forms/recommendations, they ask you to waive your rights to view them!
 - You should do this...
 - This means you should never see your rec letters!
 - This means your teachers should never give you a copy!
- Step 2: Have a face-to-face conversation with the person(s) you'd like to write for you.

Sending Teacher Recommendations

- Your teachers will see the deadlines for each college you have in Naviance
 - If you have the deadline set for January, that is what they will plan for! If you need to override a deadline for a special program, let me know and I can adjust on my end.
- If you have a Nov 1 deadline, you can submit your application on Sept 3, and your transcript and rec letters might be sent on Oct 21 (or vice versa). As long as everything makes it by the deadline, you're good!
- Provide gentle reminders and thank you notes

Counselor Forms & Letters

- A School Report Form is automatically required if you apply to any schools using Common App
- Request from a counselor
 - Could be your alpha-assigned counselor or me
 - "I'm applying to colleges using the Common App and would like for you to complete the required school report (and recommendation form). Do you think you would have time to do that by ____ (date)?"
- If you also want a full <u>letter</u> to be submitted by a counselor, you must complete the "Counselor Recommendation Survey" in Naviance.
 - Do you need something from your transcript or schedule explained?
 - Do you have information your counselor needs to share which you are not able to share elsewhere in your application?
 - Does your counselor have a perspective of you which is different from your teacher recommenders?
- Counselor must sign off on any <u>Early Decision</u> contracts, as well

Essays



Should be YOUR voice

"I want to show my colleges I'm well-rounded, so I wrote a poem in Spanish about how chess club has made me a better quarterback."

- Be careful of too much help/editing
- Does the reader know more about you than before they read your essay?
- Try not repeating information already shared in application and/or resume
- Should stay positive - even if referencing a traumatic event, focus on the triumph
- Remain on topic (you!) - be sure the question has been answered

*2019-20 Common App Essay Prompts...

(250-650 words)

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution.
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

"Every applicant has a unique story. The essay helps bring that story to life."

Why College "X" Essay?

- Some colleges ask students to write about why they have chosen to apply to their institution - - this cannot be generic!
- Research is critical to answer this question
 - Exposure during campus visits
 - Conversations with admissions reps
 - Discussions with peers who attend
 - Share the specific classes you are excited to take, or the professors you can't wait to study under
 - Which clubs/activities on campus are you eager to join
- Don't say that you want to attend their school only because you love their sports team or their high ranking in your field of study!!

Student Athlete

- Please schedule appointment with me!
- Div I or II
 - Register with NCAA Eligibility Center
 - Check requirements for eligibility
 - Scale using core GPA and sum ACT
 - Geometry B is not an approved course for NCAA eligibility
 - Send official test scores from testing agency
 - Once registered, I will upload your transcript
- If you aren't being contacted by college coaches...

- May not go on official school visit or sign national letter of intent for Div I or II until you have registered!

Demonstrated Interest


- Some selective universities want to specifically offer admission to students who they are more confident will accept/attend.
- Show that they are the top choice by
 - Applying early
 - Scheduling an official campus visit
 - Making multiple (thoughtful) contacts
 - Getting to know the rep for PCH (local fairs, high school visits, evening events in STL)

Tips for Some Top Apps

- Mizzou will not accept test scores from PCH; no rec letters or essays; application date no longer used to determine housing selection priority (watch for housing contract in Nov)
- KU, Illinios, Purdue, UC schools do not request transcript self report grades now; want only <u>final</u> transcript (in May) if you choose to attend
- Mizzou, Truman, Indiana & Wisconsin accepts Common App or school app, so you must indicate in Naviance which you are using
- Be cautious of invitations from colleges to apply -- are you a competitive applicant for that school?

FAFSA

- www.fafsa.gov
 - Use this site ONLY! Applying is FREE.
- Use the 4caster tool to determine potential aid
- Apply for your FSA ID now (<u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>)
 - Electronic signature for you and your parent, so you will both need ID
- FAFSA will become available on October 1.
 - Use income information from 2017 to complete.

CSS Profile

- College Scholarship Service
- Utilized by several hundred private institutions.
- Use institutional methodology which differs from the calculation performed by the federal government.
- CSS Profile will become available on October 1.
- The CSS collects data and sends it directly to the college.
 - student.collegeboard.org/css-financial-aid-profile




A+ Program

- Enroll Now
- Requirements
 - Cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.5
 - 95% attendance
 - 50 hours tutoring (may include up to 25 Comm Serv)
 - PE Mentor, Art Mentor, Culinary Mentor, Math Aide, After-school Algebra tutoring!
 - Proficient or Advanced on Alg 1 EOC
 - Behavior/Citizenship (no major suspensions)
- Scholarship
 - Up to 6 semesters of tuition at any MO Comm Coll
 - May use this summer at STLCC for <u>a</u> free classes!
 - Some offers at MO 4 yr universities (Truman, MO State)
