# SAMPLE COURSE DESCRIPTION #2

## *AP Drawing*

**029781 & 029782**

Grade(s): 11 – 12

1 Fine Arts Credit

Prerequisite: Drawing, Advanced Drawing, teacher recommendation and department approval

AP Drawing is structured like a college course. Its purpose is to enable those enrolled to work toward building a portfolio for assessment by the College Board in AP Drawing. This course is intended for highly motivated students committed to a serious study of drawing. AP Drawing involves a higher level of proficiency and significantly more time than other high school art courses. Performance in other drawing courses will be the criterion for placement in this class. The quality of the work should reflect first-year college-level standards. A weighted grade is given.

# MUSIC: BAND, ORCHESTRA & CHOIR

- Discuss level with instructor
- Only choir recs have been entered
- For band and orchestra, select your grade level ensemble and then adjustments might be made later
- 2 options for 9<sup>th</sup> grade band:
  - **Marching** – Enroll in Symphonic band 1<sup>st</sup> semester and Concert band 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
    - 127581 & 127512
  - **Not Marching** – Enroll in Concert band the entire year.
    - 127511 & 127512

- Must pass 6 classes prior to your season(s) of competition

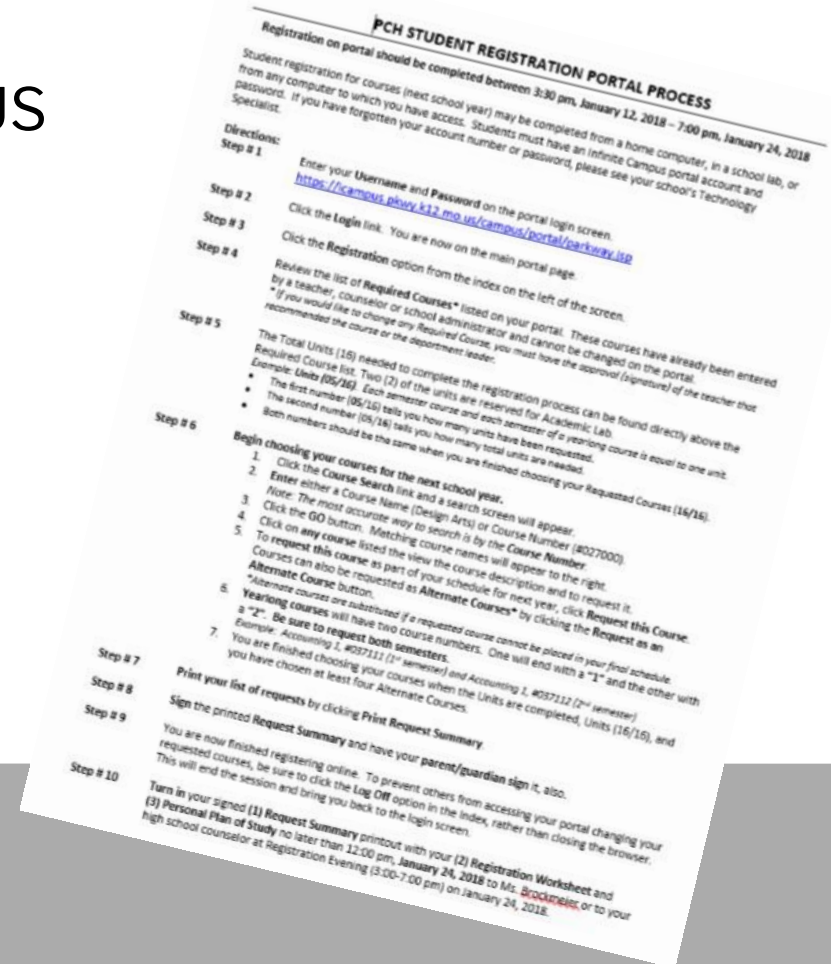

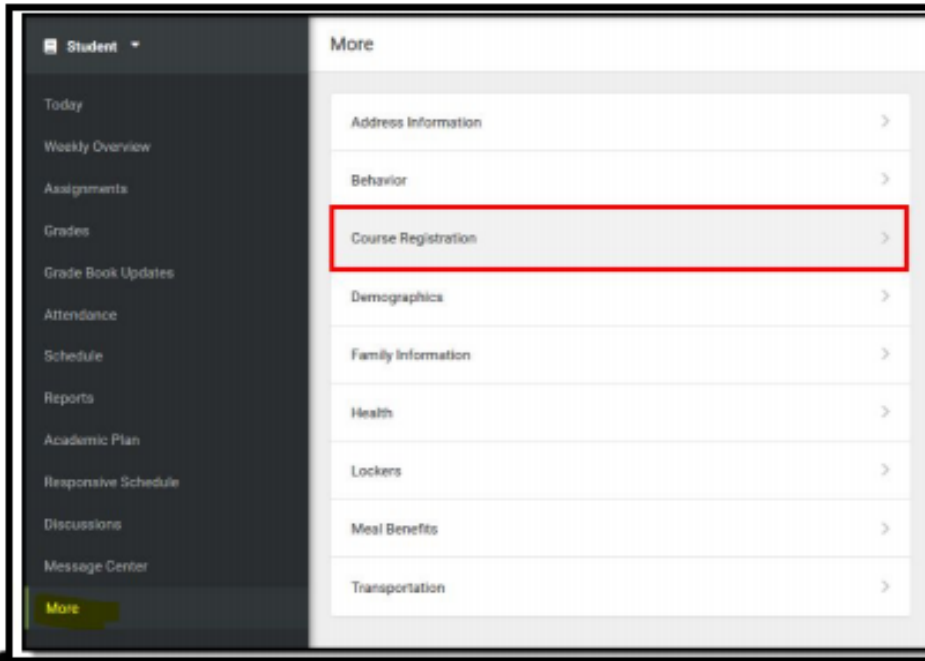
