A+ PROGRAM

- What is the A+ program?
 - Scholarship opportunity for use at any Missouri community college (ie STLCC) or public technical school (ie State Tech)
 - Tuition reimbursement for up to 6 semesters or through completion of associate's degree
- Who should sign up?
 - Everyone
 - Great fit for many students and an "insurance policy" for the rest
 - Full time enrollment during summer is only 2 courses would be free for A+ students (...works the summer immediately after senior year!)
- How does your student become eligible?
 - Sign up (Participation agreement & tutor training) □ 95% attendance □ no big suspensions □ 2.5 cumulative GPA □ show math proficiency* □ 50 hours of in-district tutoring/mentoring*
 - Sign up as early in high school as possible, but the deadline is Feb 1 of senior year.
 - If the student is eligible for a Pell Grant, then that pays out before any A+ funds

HOW DO THEY GET 50 HOURS?!

- Peer tutoring at Central High (on campus with teacher)
- Elementary summer school tutoring
- Elective mentoring courses at PCH (grade, credit and hours!)
 - PE Mentor, Visual Arts Mentor, Culinary Mentor
- Counselor at Outdoor School (6th Grade Camp)
- Parkway PATH (Peers Advocating for Total Health)
- Link Crew Leader
- Not necessary, but may submit 0-25 hours of community service with a non-profit organization to reduce the number of tutoring/mentoring hours.

A+ PROGRAM WEBSITE

COLLEGE ATHLETICS

• NCAA

- Div 1 or 2 register with the NCAA eligibility center (\$100) by April of junior year
- Div 3 no athletic scholarships, so no eligibility requirements (get into the school!)
- Communicate with Mrs. Prange do you know <u>core</u> GPA?
 - "2.3 or take a knee" for Div 1
 - Download the Guide for College-Bound Student-Athletes from the PCH Counseling site

• NAIA

- Also awards scholarships!
- Register (\$100) by April of junior year
- 2.3 GPA or 2.0 & 18

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

- Portfolios online, via "Slideroom" or through "Portfolio Days"
- Auditions live or previously recorded; often require pre-screening audition videos
- Deadlines may vary significantly from regular admissions process
- Supplemental material even for non-majors

ACT/SAT

- Check admission, scholarship and competitive program requirements and plan a testing schedule accordingly.
- ACT or SAT colleges do NOT care
- Both tests are offered about every other month
- Some schools "superscore" advantage of testing more than once
- Parkway pays for all students to take the ACT in spring of junior year
 - all juniors are automatically registered for this official test
 - all freshmen take practice ACT and sophomores take the PreACT
- Fee waivers available for national test dates if families qualify for meal benefits in Parkway

REGISTERING FOR ACT/SAT

ACT

- Register at <u>www.act.org</u>
 - \$65-94 depending on sections requested
 - FRL = 4 waivers
- Saturday testing opportunities in:
 - September
 - October
 - December
 - February
 - April
 - June
 - July
- Deadlines to register or apply for accommodations typically 6 weeks prior

SAT

- Register at <u>www.collegeboard.org</u>
 - \$68
 - FRL = 2 waivers
- Saturday testing opportunities in:
 - August
 - October
 - November
 - December
 - March
 - May
 - June
- Deadlines to register or apply for accommodations typically 6 weeks prior

FAIR REGISTRATION

PREPARING FOR A FAIR

- 1. Register for the event and come with your QR code for scanning.
- 2. Map out who you'd like to see! Some lines are longer than others...
- 3. Develop your list of questions you can't easily find answers to on their website.
- 4. Be adventurous. Don't just talk to the well-known schools.
- 5. While it is absolutely acceptable and even expected for parents to ask questions, the student should introduce themselves and always try to ask the first question.
- 6. Take notes it's easy to forget who said what after meeting with several dozen representatives ☺

VISITING COLLEGE CAMPUSES

- Be intentional
- Explore a variety of different types of campuses
- Try to visit when school is in session
 - Helpful if you can get to see the community and meet with professors/students
- Register through the office of admissions
 - Junior Visits Days
 - Admitted Student Days
 - Individual tours
- Students may also sign up to meet with college representatives when they schedule visits to PCH!

MENTORS 4 COLLEGE

- **FREE** program to help Parkway families on their college journey
- Volunteers assist with:
 - navigating the overwhelming journey to college
 - identifying best college fit
 - selecting colleges to which you want to apply
 - preparing your applications and essays
- Not replacing, but <u>supporting</u> PCH Counselors
- Offer a variety of workshops for students (ie essay writing and interviewing)

Futures in Action (FIA)

- Peggy Hull, Program Administrator
- Program designed to support students underrepresented on college campuses (students of color, families with financial barriers, and first-generation college students)
- Sessions typically scheduled during Ac Lab throughout the school year; often offers virtual sessions in the evenings

UMSL BRIDGE PROGRAMS

• Provides academic programing and career development services to college-bound high school students in the St. Louis community.

• FREE

• Bridge Program Summer Academy

- mid-June to mid-July for students currently in grades 9 through 10 and offers academic enrichment courses in mathematics, science, written and oral communication, career research, personal and professional development and activities that support college planning.
- Requires 2.5 GPA and completion of Algebra
- Application in spring
