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# **Standardized Testing**

- Colleges often use scores from standardized tests for one data point in admissions
- Some students do very well and others struggle on timed exams
- Most recently, colleges have been placing less emphasize on ACT/SAT scores
- ▶ We also have a current reality of limited testing opportunities
- Test Optional Admissions (or pathways)
  - You can have test scores and still choose not to share them with colleges
- Monitor trends over the next 6 months

# **Test Optional Schools**

#### FairTest.org

- If your GPA/transcript alone makes you competitive for admission, but your test score is below average for their institution, don't send it.
- Some schools do require another application piece to replace the test score, but most do not.
- Pay attention to scholarship requirements!
  - The test score might be competitive for admission, but prevent you from getting a higher scholarship that your GPA alone would have met!
- Check policies on each individual college website for the most current information!

# **Testing Options**

- ACT (with or without writing)
- ► SAT (with or without essay)
- SAT Subject Tests requested by few
- Colleges have NO preference on test other than if there is writing/no writing!

- ► What does your testing calendar look like?
- The district is still hoping to offer a free ACT to all juniors on April 13<sup>th</sup> students will be automatically registered for that exam. All other testing opportunities would be planned through the ACT website (testing offered about every other month)

\*Sending score reports to colleges  $\rightarrow$  \$13 per school (4 free during registration)

SAT www.collegeboard.org

- Mar 13
- May 8
- Jun 5

Without Writing  $\rightarrow$  \$52 With Writing  $\rightarrow$  \$68

#### Fee Waivers

Students who qualify for meal benefits through Parkway are eligible for 2 fee waivers for ACT and 2 fee waivers for SAT

Parkway pays for the ACT in April of junior year for <u>all</u> students

### **Testing Accommodations**

- Discuss with your comprehensive counselor
- Accommodations must be approved by ACT/College Board well in advance of testing date (up to 6 weeks before testing!)
  - ▶ Deadline to request accommodations for the April 13<sup>th</sup> test is February 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Testing agency determines which accommodations are authorized

### Superscore

| 1 | 21              | 23              | 21              | 17              | -       | 21        |
| 2 | 20              | 24              | 23              | 23              | -       | 23        |
| 3 | 22              | <mark>26</mark> | <mark>26</mark> | 25              | -       | 25        |
| 4 | <mark>23</mark> | 25              | 24              | 26              | 12      | 25        |
| 5 | 22              | 24              | 23              | <mark>27</mark> | -       | 23        |

**Highest composite**  $\rightarrow$  send test 3 or 4

ACT w/ Writing Required → send test 4

Superscore  $\rightarrow$  send test 3, 4 & 5  $\rightarrow$  (23+26+26+27)/4 = 25.5 = 26!
