

CAREER/TECHNICAL SCHOOLS

Career/tech schools typically offer programs that take **two years or less** to complete.

These schools provide students with formal classes and hands-on experiences related to their future career interests.

Students may earn a diploma or a certificate, prepare for a licensing exam, or study to begin work as an apprentice or a journeyman in a skilled trade.

In as little as two years, you could be earning up to \$40,000, \$50,000 or even \$60,000 per year.



TWO-YEAR COLLEGES

- Community Colleges

- Ex: St. Louis Community College

- 4 campus locations (Meramec, Wildwood, Forest Park, Florissant Valley)

- Open Enrollment!

- No minimum GPA or ACT scores

- Tuition for one year is around \$4500

- Room & Board *generally* not available

- Earn your Associate's Degree or complete general education requirements.

FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES

Many students attend a four-year college after graduating from high school.

They earn a degree once they have completed a program of study.

A four-year college usually offers a **bachelor's degree** in the arts “BA” (e.g., English, history, drama) or sciences “BS” (e.g., biology, computer science, engineering).

Some four-year colleges also offer advanced degrees, such as master's or other graduate degrees. This typically changes their school name from “College” to “University”.



FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES

- Over 2000 options in the United States
- Admission requirements vary based on selectivity
 - Minimum is typically around 2.0 GPA and 18 ACT
- Tuition, Room & Board - \$\$\$

- **ROTC (Reserve Officer Training Corps)**

- Officer training program for college students who commit to serve in the U.S. military after college
- Available at over 1,700 colleges and universities
- Commit to serving in the military after college
- College scholarships available (up to full ride)

- **Military Academies**

- 5 options
- Extremely competitive for admissions (similar to Ivy)
 - Process starts as early as junior year!
- Tuition/room/board covered!

Alternative Options Available

- **Apprenticeships**
 - *St. Louis Carpenters Joint Apprenticeship Program*
 - *Earn Associate's Degree*
- **Training Programs**
 - **Cosmetology**
 - Can usually complete in one year
 - Tuition ranges by school - \$11-21K
- **Gap Year**
 - Some programs are as expensive as college...







RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

- Current perspectives (11th/12th grade) from those who know you well at time of application
- Ability to speak to your academic achievements and potential, how you collaborate with peers, what you contribute to the classroom and greater community.
- Core teacher(s) and/or your counselor



ESSAYS



College essay prompts (usually multiple options)

Supplemental essays (why college X, why that major, why that activity, etc.)

- Use your voice
- Brainstorm ideas
- Be truthful
- Do not repeat information already shared
- Keep it positive
- Stay focused

CALCULATED V. HOLISTIC REVIEW

Calculated

- ❑ Guaranteed admission if you meet minimum requirements. Review could include GPA, ACT/SAT, and curriculum taken.
 - ❑ Examples – Mizzou, MO State, Kansas
-

Holistic

- ❑ Looking at applicant as a whole person
- ❑ Often includes resume, essay, recommendation letters
- ❑ Examples – Wash U, Truman, Indiana, Michigan, Tulane



Examples of NON-RESIDENT Scholarships

KU (COA: \$45,000)

□ 3.25 = \$8,000/yr; 3.5 = \$10,000/yr; 3.70 = \$12,000/yr; 3.85 = \$14,000/yr; 3.95 = \$16,000/yr.

Arkansas (COA: \$51,000)

□ 3.2 = 70% off difference between in and out of state; 3.6 = 80%; 3.8 = 90% (around \$18,500/yr)

Alabama (COA: \$55,000)

□ 3.5+ and ACT of 25 = \$6,000; 27 = \$8,000; 28 = \$10,000; 29 = \$15,000; 30 = \$24,000; 32 = \$28,000 (all per year)

Murray State (TN) (COA: \$24,000)

□ Regional tuition rate for all MO students; May also earn academic scholarships for GPA or GPA+test ranges, up to full tuition

Univ of South Florida (COA: \$31,000)

Basic Requirements

- ❑ Cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.5
- ❑ 95% attendance
- ❑ 50 hours tutoring or mentoring other Parkway students
 - ❑ 0-25 hours may be community service
- ❑ Proficient or Advanced on Alg 1 EOC or meet PreACT/ACT math requirements
- ❑ Good Behavior/Citizenship

Scholarship

- ❑ Up to 6 semesters of tuition at any MO Community College or public trade/tech school
- ❑ May use summer after high school graduation at STLCC for 2 free classes!
- ❑ Some smaller scholarship offers (ex: \$500/year) at MO 4 yr universities (Truman, MO State, Webster)
