Parkway North Attendance Guidelines

Your success at North will depend heavily upon regular school attendance. Students, parents and the school all have responsibilities in this area.

Student Responsibilities

- 1. Students are expected to be in school every day and on time for each block.
- 2. Students must remain on campus the entire day. This includes lunch periods and Academic Lab. Students are not to go to the parking lots or leave campus at any time.
- 3. Students arriving late must report to the <u>Welcome Center/Attendance Office near the main entrance</u> to sign in. Students arriving on a late bus are to report there for a late bus admittance pass.
- 4. Students needing to leave campus during the day must obtain a dismissal slip from the Welcome Center/Attendance Office prior to leaving campus. Obtaining a pass requires a phone call from a parent stating the reason for the early dismissal. The dismissal slip must be presented to teachers when the students leave and when they return.

Parental Responsibilities

1. Absences are excused only when a parent or guardian calls the grade level office <u>within 24 hours of the child's</u> <u>absence</u>. These calls are answered by the grade level secretary. Voice mail is available 24 hours a day for parents to leave such messages after regular school hours. By board policy, the following are considered excused absences:

- a. Illness of the student
- b. Death in the student's immediate family
- c. Certain days for religious observance
- d. Medical or dental appointments
- e. Court appearance
- f. Quarantine or hospital confinement
- g. Field trips or other school-initiated absences
- h. Emergency or set of circumstances that, in the judgment of the principal, constitutes a reasonable cause of absence from school (oversleeping, car trouble, missing the bus, running parental errands, babysitting, etc. are NOT emergencies)
- 2. If students are on a school trip (either for the day or for several days), parents do not need to report their absence, as their teacher will have reported them being on the trip.
- 3. Parents must call the grade level office when their child will arrive shortly after the start of the day due to an appointment or emergency, or must leave early for these reasons.

Long-Term Illness Procedures

Parents communicate with the grade level office. The secretary will then notify teachers, counselor and grade level administrator. If a student is absent for two weeks or longer, please notify the nurse. Following such an extended absence, a doctor's letter or hospital discharge papers will be needed to return to school.



New Student Orientation

Freshmen and other students new to North High are invited to orientation on Monday, August 12, from 7:30 - 11:00 am. We have planned this event to simulate the first two days of school. Students will ride their assigned buses to school and will receive their class schedules. They will meet their teachers and find their way around the building by doing a trial run of their schedules.

Immunizations

It is very important that student immunizations be up-to-date by the first day of school. This is mandated by the state, so **if your student's records aren't current and on file with our nurse, he/she won't be allowed to attend classes.**



It is required that **ALL** seniors receive the 2nd dose of the <u>meningococcal vaccine (MCV4) in order to begin school.</u> The exception is if the student received their 1st dose at 16 years or older. Open House



Welcome back students! Parents, we would like to partner with you to have a successful year where your student learns and grows! Math is quite different now, as the delivery of math instruction has changed drastically. We've moved from a model of "just do it because..." to garnering a better understanding of not just how, but why, we perform math.



In Algebra 1 we use standard-based grading and test students until they prove their proficiency in a topic. Please attend Open House on August 22 and look for a future email from your Algebra 1 teacher describing what to expect. In all classes we have to make math real to the students; we are preparing them for a world much different than the one we grew up in. The math skills that they learn from here on out are absolutely critical. No matter their career choice in the very near future, a strong foundation in math will be paramount to their success!

It is suggested that your student has access to *calculator graphing* (Algebra 2 or higher) or scientific (Algebra and Geometry). The math department at PNH uses Ti-Nspire graphing calculator or Ti-30xs multiview...but really any will do. Students should have a notebook, folder or binder, and a



pencil as well.

There are *Summer Skills Packets* located <u>here</u> on the math department page. It is incredibly helpful to have your student work on these before going back to school. The amount of materials forgotten over summer break can be alarming.

Homework is critical for practice for a student. In EVERY math class they get homework EVERY day...so please be on the lookout for it. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the teacher and we will work together to make sure all students are working towards their potential.

- I hereby give my permission for the Student to retain in his/her possession a metered-dose inhaler, and to selfadminister medication from such inhaler. This permission shall be effective during the school day; on school property, including but not limited to a school bus; and at all school activities, whether on or off school property or occurring during the regular school day.
- I have provided the District with a written medical history of the Student's experience with asthma or other potentially life-threatening respiratory illness ("Condition") and a plan of action for addressing any emergency situations that could reasonably be anticipated as a consequence of administering the medication and having the Condition.
- I have provided the District with written certification from the Student's physician, stating that the Student (a) has the aforementioned Condition and (b) is capable of, and has been instructed in, the proper method of self-administration of medication and informed of the dangers of permitting other persons to use the medicine prescribed for the Student.
- I understand that the District and its employees or agents may disclose information provided in accordance with the foregoing paragraphs to administrators, school nurses, teachers, and other school employees as may be necessary to protect the health of the Student and to establish that the Student has been authorized to self-administer medication by means of a metered-dose inhaler, and shall incur no liability for the disclosure of such information.
- I understand that the District and its employees or agents shall incur no liability as a result of any injury arising from the self-administration of medication by the Student, and that I shall be required to indemnify and hold harmless the District and its employees or agents against any claims arising out of the self-administration of medication by the Student.
- I understand that this permission form is effective for the school year for which it is granted, and that a new Permission Form and supporting documentation as described above, must be submitted for each school year.
- I agree to supervise that my child carries his/her rescue inhaler, that the device contains medication, that the date on the device is current, and that the device is labeled with the student's name and prescription label.
- It has been recommended to me that a back-up rescue inhaler be provided to the Health Office for emergencies.
- I have been advised to provide a complete Asthma Action Plan from our physician.
- I will review the status of my student's asthma with my student on a regular basis.



Parking Permit Application 2019-2020

Parking Guidelines and Information

- In order to participate in this privilege, students must be in good standing (e.g. no fines in the school store, no excessive tardies or absences), apply for and purchase a parking permit, be assigned a parking space, and follow the regulations governing students parking on campus.
- Students must possess a valid driver's license and have their car(s) insured.
- Parking permits are the property of North High. They may not be sold or transferred to other students for any reason.
- Only juniors and seniors may obtain parking permits. Students who park illegally on campus may not be eligible to purchase a parking permit in later years.
- Student parking will be by assigned space. Student parking is not allowed on the staff lot.
- If you arrive at school and someone is parked in your space, park in visitor parking and notify the staff member at the Attendance window immediately upon entering school.
- Students may not return to the parking lot during school hours without a pass from a teacher or administrator.
- Parking in a location other than your assigned spot will result in a **<u>\$15.00</u>** fine per incidence.
- Lost parking permits will be replaced for a <u>\$15.00</u> fee.
- The Parkway School District retains authority to conduct routine patrols of student parking lots and inspections of the exteriors of student vehicles on school property.
- The Parkway School District may inspect the interiors of student vehicles whenever a school official has reasonable suspicion to believe illegal or unauthorized materials are contained inside the vehicle.
- Students engaging in behavior which is unsafe (i.e. speeding, disregarding driving rules, etc.) may have their parking permit revoked on the first offense.
- Any student caught leaving campus without proper authorization during school hours will be warned once. On the second offense, the student's parking permit will be revoked.
- Repeated violations of these conditions shall result in increasingly severe consequences, including revocation of parking privileges or suspension from school.

I agree to the conditions set forth on the directions in this application, in the Student Handbook and, on a daily basis, by school personnel.

I will forfeit the parking permit and parking privileges when asked to do so by school personnel.

I understand that parking is a privilege, not a right, and that abusing this privilege may result in disciplinary action.

I will not hold Parkway School District or Parkway North High School responsible for any loss or damage to vehicles or property contained therein.


