Dear North High Families:

The last six weeks of the fall semester are under way, and 12-week grades will be available via Infinite Campus toward the middle of the week. If you have any concerns regarding your student's progress, please do not hesitate to contact their teachers.

As we move deeper into the semester, students should prepare to finish strong. Encourage your students to create a study plan for final exams that are scheduled for the week of December 16. Staff members will begin conversations with students about potential offerings during the course registration process for the 2020-21 school year, beginning in December. As registration materials become available toward the end of the semester, invite your student to discuss their four-year/graduation plan and how the course selection process is an important part of their post-secondary preparation plan.

We have been able to sustain numerous extracurricular opportunities for our students, and I am grateful for the service they provide to our school community. Our student council did an amazing job with all the activities planned during Homecoming 2019. The Maryland Heights police and Chamber of Commerce, along with the Parkway School District, provided North High an opportunity to hear from former NBA player Chris Herren, who shared his life story with our entire student body. North High's National Honor Society inducted new members and sponsored one of their semester blood drives, which produced over 66 units of blood for the Mississippi Valley Regional Blood Center. The North High Safe and Drug-Free Council sponsored Trunk or Treat in the commons at North; the event drew 1000+ participants on the eve of Halloween. Our students have been involved in the fall drama production, band and choir concerts and competitions, along with a host of other activities. A special thanks to all the students, staff, and parents that supported our teams, clubs, and organizations throughout the fall season. We look forward to the continued support of our community.

Please encourage your students to stay connected and get involved. Research shows that being involved in extracurricular activities serves students well by offering a sense of community and belonging. As always, we welcome your partnership and encourage you to reach out to us any time you have questions or concerns.

Parkway North Attendance Guidelines

Your success at North will depend heavily upon regular school attendance. Students, parents and the school all have responsibilities in this area.

Student Responsibilities

- 1. Students are expected to be in school every day and on time for each block.
- 2. Students must remain on campus the entire day. This includes lunch periods and Academic Lab. Students are not to go to the parking lots or leave campus at any time.
- 3. Students arriving late must report to the <u>Welcome Center/Attendance Office near the main entrance</u> to sign in. Students arriving on a late bus are to report there for a late bus admittance pass.
- 4. Students needing to leave campus during the day must obtain a dismissal slip from the Welcome Center/Attendance Office prior to leaving campus. Obtaining a pass requires a phone call from a parent stating the reason for the early dismissal. The dismissal slip must be presented to teachers when the students leave and when they return.

Parental Responsibilities

- 1. Absences are excused only when a parent or guardian calls the grade level office within 24 hours of the child's absence. These calls are answered by the grade level secretary. Voice mail is available 24 hours a day for parents to leave such messages after regular school hours. By board policy, the following are considered excused absences:
 - a. Illness of the student
 - b. Death in the student's immediate family
 - c. Certain days for religious observance
 - d. Medical or dental appointments
 - e. Court appearance
 - f. Quarantine or hospital confinement
 - g. Field trips or other school-initiated absences
 - h. Emergency or set of circumstances that, in the judgment of the principal, constitutes a reasonable cause of absence from school (oversleeping, car trouble, missing the bus, running parental errands, babysitting, etc. are NOT emergencies)
- 2. If students are on a school trip (either for the day or for several days), parents do not need to report their absence, as their teacher will have reported them being on the trip.
- 3. Parents must call the grade level office when their child will arrive shortly after the start of the day due to an appointment or emergency, or must leave early for these reasons.

Long-Term Illness Procedures

Parents communicate with the grade level office. The secretary will then notify teachers, counselor and grade level administrator. If a student is absent for two weeks or longer, please notify the nurse. Following such an extended absence, a doctor's letter or hospital discharge papers will be needed to return to school.



In late July, the cheer program attended a National Cheerleaders Association cheer camp, where teams enter various competitions. Here are the awards won:






