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Library News

Library Databases:

The library subscribes to a variety of databases specializing in a broad range of disciplines, that give students access to articles and multimedia resources to support their research. Students can access the databases, either by subject or database name, on the library webpage. Students can also access these databases from home using a designated username and password. 
We will showcase over 100 crafters and vendors offering unique and festive homemade gifts. All proceeds benefit the North High band program. See the enclosed flyer for additional details.

Scholarships



We are starting to receive applications for various national and regional scholarship competitions, which we have listed on the Counseling website. Seniors should also be searching for scholarships online. Sites like <u>fastweb.com</u>, <u>scholarship.com</u> and <u>savingforcollege.com</u> are wonderful resources.

College Visits

Seniors may sign up via their Naviance accounts to meet with college reps visiting North. The list of college visits is available on the landing page for each student's Navaince account. Sign up is required no later that 2:00 the day prior to the event.

Counselor Recommendations

If a college you are applying to requires a counselor recommendation, complete your Recommendation Survey and submit a formal request via Naviance *at least* <u>10 school days</u> prior to when you need your letter mailed. **Students will be held responsible for being aware of deadlines and requirements for both college and scholarship applica-tions.** It's important that students complete their own applications. Parent may assist, but students must take ownership of this process and do their own work.

Seniors

Mrs. Wills wants to meet with EVERY senior before winter break, to discuss your plans for life after Parkway North. Stop by the guidance office to make an appointment!

Juniors

Use your current GPA to help guide your college search. Then begin visiting those schools. Things to question: cost, location, class size, programs offered, and available financial aid.

Sophomores

It's not too early to start investigating your options! Use this year to begin answering basic questions:

- How far from home do I want to go?
- What size school do I want to attend?
- Does my current academic record reflect my goals?

Freshmen

Start your high school career on a good note: When seniors apply to colleges in the fall, the schools only see records from your first three years when evaluating applicants, so make freshman year a good one!

WHabits of Highly Effective Teens

For Parents:

Freshman leadership labs are learning about *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens* throughout this year. We are currently introducing **Habit 1—Be Proactive**. Being proactive means taking responsibility for your life and not blaming outside sources. We used the language "circle of influence" to explain that personal energy should be used for things that are in our control, and not those that we have no control over. The lesson focuses on being *proactive* instead of *reactive*.

As teens begin to rely more on their peer group, they can allow a rude comment by a friend to ruin their whole day and are easily led into misbehavior by their peer group. As a parent, it's important to help your teenager understand the importance of taking responsibilities for their life choices. For example, when your child disagrees with a teacher, encourage him to make an appointment with the teacher to discuss it one-on-one instead of doing it for him. Or, the next time your child forgets homework or his sports equipment, think hard before coming to the rescue.

For Teachers:

Be Proactive is about taking responsibility for your life. You can't keep blaming everything on your parents or grandparents. Proactive people recognize that they are "response-able." They don't blame genetics, circumstances, conditions, or conditioning for their behavior. They know they choose their behavior.

Reactive people, on the other hand, are often affected by their physical environment. They find external sources to blame for their behavior. Between the stimulus and the response is your greatest power--you have the freedom to choose your response. One of the most important things you choose is what you say. Your language is a good indicator of how you see yourself.

A proactive person uses proactive language: I can, I will, I prefer, etc. A reactive person uses reactive language: I can't, I have to, if only. Reactive people believe they are not responsible for what they say and do, that they have no choice.

Instead of reacting to or worrying about conditions over which they have little or no control, proactive people focus their time and energy on things they can control. The problems, challenges, and opportunities we face fall into two areas--Circle of Concern and Circle of Influence.

Proactive people focus their efforts on their Circle of Influence. They work on the things they can do something about: health, children, problems at work. Reactive people focus their efforts in the Circle of Concern--things over which they have little or no control: the national debt, terrorism, weather. Gaining an awareness of the areas in which we expend our energies in is a giant step in becoming proactive.

Junior Counselor Corner Chandra Brown, Class of 2019

Welcome to your junior year of high school! Your first two years of high school were over quicker than you anticipated, so now is the time you begin taking on more responsibilities in life, as well as academically. Before you know it, you will be picking out class rings, ordering senior jerseys and finalizing your post-secondary goals; this is how quickly your high school career is speeding towards graduation. Take time out to make memories, get involved in your community, and forge healthy relationships. You will be a senior before you know it!

On August 16 you embarked upon one of the final tiers of high school planning!!! Your junior year begins with new, focused goals, a better outlook on your future, and expectations to become the BEST version of you possible. You are considered building leaders for all underclassmen, and we are relying on YOU to set an example through behavior, leadership and positivity.

The mission of Parkway North High School is to develop self-directed, creative, critical thinkers who are socially responsible people prepared for an ever-changing world. Our goal is to ensure that we are supporting families throughout high school, as well as preparing students for responsibilities after high school.

Here is a review of tips for a successful junior year:

- * Try and get at least 6-8 hours of sleep at night and eat breakfast in the morning
- * Rotating block schedule: A-Day is blocks 1-4, and B-Day is blocks 5-8
 - Homework: Most classes at North High have homework assignments, and the A/B day schedule allows you to ask questions the following day, if necessary. (Take advantage of the block schedule and complete homework the day it is assigned!

• Academic Lab: You have two opportunities during lab to travel to see teachers. Be mindful that lab is not a time for individual support, but rather, more of a group approach. If you need individual support, you will need to arrange a time before or after school. Be mindful that lab is a privilege, not a requirement, and we hope you use it as such. Dr. Page, your academic lab teacher and I will work to make sure this time is being used effectively.

* Grades and Credits

• You should be starting your junior year with at least <u>14 credits</u>. If you have less than this, we will develop a plan to help you meet graduation requirements.

• You may earn up to 3.5 credits per semester for a total of 7 credits at the end of the school year. By next May, you should have a total of <u>21 credits</u>, and will only need to earn 10 more to meet graduation requirements.

• Remember, EVERY grade counts. Each semester your grade point average will be added into your rolling cumulative GPA. The better your grades are, the more opportunities you will have after graduation.

Organization

• Use your planner or electronic device to organize your time and establish routines. Routines help with finishing projects, remaining current in class and content and ensuring you have time for yourself.

- Plan ahead & schedule time for your after-school activities and homework.
- Schedule sufficient time to study and complete homework.
- Don't forget to plan for enough time for rest, family and friends, too.

Self- Advocacy

- YOU are your number one advocate. Use your voice to ask questions, to verify information, clarify understanding.
- * Get Involved
 - Find a club, sport or extra-curricular activity to get involved in. School can be much more than only earning credits towards graduation.

• Take advantage of the A+ Program, which incorporates district-approved volunteer work, 95% attendance and minimum 2.5 grade point average






