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Dear North High Families,

The mission of the Parkway School District is to ensure all students are capable, curious, caring and confident learners who understand and respond to the challenges of an ever-changing world.

As part of the Parkway Schools Continuous School Improvement Process, the Board of Education accepted the recommendation of the Project Parkway Steering Committee and added the word 'caring' to the District mission statement. The addition of this single word is significant because it reinforces the importance of our schools being a place where students learn the value of understanding how they are in relationship to others in their classes, the school, the St. Louis region, the USA, and the world. Adding the word 'caring' causes us all to focus on our attitude toward others. One could argue that at North High we've long emphasized the idea of caring for and about others; this change in the District mission statement affirms that which has been at the core of who we are as a school community.

This school year we will engage in conversation each month during academic lab about what it means to be a caring member of a community, and how we can demonstrate that care and concern for others. We will ask students to think about themselves and issues or causes that are important to them. We will explore the systems and structures within our region that promote care and concern for other members of the community. Ultimately, we will participate in an all-school day of service in April. Many of our students devote countless hours to community service so the concept of giving back to the community is not a new one.

The goal of having every student and staff member involved in service to others on the same day is what makes this a new endeavor for us. In order for this idea to become a reality we have to involve all the students and staff in the process. Honestly, that's probably the most challenging part for me--stepping back and letting others make decisions and plans for the day. I have great confidence in our students and staff and know it will all come together in the end. I can anticipate that the logistics of the plan will require lots of coordination so we may call on parents to help implement the plan. I will keep you updated on this project throughout the year, but if you have ideas, please feel free to share them with me.

Principal's Letter, cont.

One of the first steps in demonstrating you are a caring person is to know the names of the other people in your classes. I put this out as a challenge to all students in our back-to-school assembly. I encouraged them to get to know the name of every person in every class. Being able to call someone by name is a sign of respect for the other person and that you care about them enough to know their name. Knowing the names of the other students in the classroom indicates that you value the relationship you have with them as classmates, and that you value the contributions they will make to the classroom.

I attended a Character Education conference this summer and heard one of the speakers say, "Being on a team and being a teammate are two different things. Being in the same class and being a classmate are two different things." The speaker was indicating that simply sharing space together on a team or in a classroom does not require that two people care about each other. You have to take steps beyond simply sharing space to show that you care, and you must allow the other person to demonstrate care and concern for you. These are relationship skills that we all work on every day of our lives.

We are fortunate to have a caring school community. However, each year we welcome hundreds of new students and families into the North High community. It is imperative that we take time to learn about each other and find ways to build relationships with each other. I hope you engage in conversation with your children about how they get to know others, as well as how they show care and concern for all members of our school community.

I look forward to seeing you on campus this fall!

Dear Freshman Families:

Welcome to high school! Please ask your student to share with you the handouts and introductory information they received from the teachers. Often teachers have assigned class points for getting parent signatures on such forms. I encourage you to place teacher e-mails and websites in locations easily accessible to you. It is perfectly acceptable to get clarifications from teachers (even if your student discourages you from doing so!)



As a reminder, students are expected to read/study/prepare every night. Be very wary if your student tells you all his/her homework was completed in academic lab. The intention of ac lab is to continue to study and get teacher assistance, not for homework time. (Remember ac lab is only on B days.)

Sophomores should have a total of 7 credits cumulative (each year students receive 7 credits if they pass all of their courses). Again, it is important to make sure students maintain a rigorous course load if their plans are to transition to a post-secondary institution. Complete homework on the day assigned, not the day before it's due. Ask questions and use academic lab time wisely, and most importantly, please free to see me at any time.

Seniors

As the new school year begins, our goal in Guidance is to meet with all of you and ensure we have a transition plan in place for life after Parkway. Seniors should have a total of 21 credits cumulative (each year students receive 7 credits if they pass all of their courses). Please take the time to look at your transcript and figure out how many credits you have currently. You will also want to begin looking at how many years of core courses and/or foreign language your admitting institution requires; this should drive your course selection.

Graduation requirements are: 3 units of social studies, science and math; 4 units of English; 7 units of electives (additional credits in core courses count as elective credit); 1 credit of fine arts, 1.5 of career and tech education (including personal finance); and 1.5 of PE (including health). All Parkway graduates will need to have met or surpass these requirements to graduate.

Options for seniors who have met or surpassed this requirement would be:

- -Student Aide
- -Cadet Teaching
- -Dual Enrollment
- -Partial Attendance

Again, it is important to make sure students maintain a rigorous course load if their plans are to transition to a post-secondary institution. Beginning September 8, we will begin to push-in to senior English and Language Arts classes to review important things they need to know about life after North. You will be able to find that information on our website

Things to consider:

- -Naviance login and password; ALL post-secondary documents are submitted through this portal
- -Credit checks: Am I on track for graduation? What do I still need?
- -Application deadlines: Create a plan which includes submission of required documents by priority deadlines
- -ACT: If you plan to take it again, be sure to sign up in October or November at actstudent.org
- -Letters of recommendation: If you plan to ask teachers to write letters, you need to make sure **you make contact** with them prior to the request
- -Finally, enjoy your senior year!!! It will be here and gone before you know it!
