SOPHOMORES

It's not too early to start investigating your options. Use this year to begin answering basic questions:

- How far from home do I want to go?
- What size school do I want to attend?
- Is my current academic record reflecting my goals?

FRESHMEN

Start your high school career on a good note! Believe it or not, seniors apply to college in the fall, meaning that colleges see only the first 3 years of high school when they first evaluate their applicants. Make freshman year a good one!

Guidance

Welcome to your senior year of high school! Your first three years of high school were over quicker than you anticipated, and now you are transitioning to your life beyond North. You will be picking out class rings, ordering senior jerseys and finalizing your plans for after Parkway North. This is how quickly your high school career is speeding towards graduation. Take time out to make memories, become involved in your community, and bridge healthy relationships.

This year begins with new focused goals, a better outlook on your future, and expectations to continue to become the BEST version of you possible. Your senior year you are a leader at North for all underclassmen, and we are relying on YOU to be the example through behavior, leadership and positivity.

The mission of Parkway North High School is to develop self-directed, creative, critical thinkers who are socially responsible people prepared for an ever-changing world. Our goal is to ensure that we are supporting families throughout high school, as well as preparing students for goals and responsibilities after graduation.

Here is a review of tips for a successful year:

- Try and get at least 6-8 hours of rest at night and eat breakfast each day
- Remember, we have a rotating-block schedule: A-Day is blocks 1-4, and B-Day is blocks 5-8
- Homework: Most classes at North High will have homework assignments, and the A/B day schedule will allow you to ask questions the following day, if necessary. (Please take advantage of the block schedule and complete homework the day it is assigned!)

• Take advantage of academic lab: You will have two opportunities to travel to see teachers. Be mindful that lab is not a time for individual support, but rather more of a group approach. If you need individual support, you will need to arrange a time outside of regular class time (i.e. before or after school). Be mindful that academic lab is a privilege, not a requirement, and we hope you use it as such. Dr. Page, your academic lab teacher, and I will work to make sure this time is being used effectively.

Grades and Credits

- You should be starting your senior year with at least <u>21 credits</u>. If you have less than this, we will develop a plan for helping you meet graduation requirements.
- You may earn up to 3.5 credits per semester, or a total of 7 credits, at the end of each school year. By the end of this school year, you should have a total of **28 credits/minimally 24 credits to meet graduation requirements.**
- Remember, **EVERY** grade counts. Each semester, your grade point average will be added into your rolling cumulative GPA. The better your grades are, the more opportunities you will have after graduation.
- You will apply to post-secondary institutions with your junior year grades and your previous ACT scores. Admission will be "conditional" and will not become official until they have received your FINAL transcript.

Organization

- Use your student planner or mobile device to organize your time and establish routines for each day. Routines help with finishing projects, remaining current in class and content, and ensuring you have time for yourself.
- Create a calendar with important dates, deadlines and application submissions. This will help keep you current and ahead with applying for scholarships and admission to college.
- Plan ahead & schedule time for your after school activities and homework
- Don't forget to plan for enough time for rest, family and friends, too!

Self- Advocacy

- YOU are your number one advocate. Use your voice to ask questions, verify information, and clarify understanding.
- Feel free to visit me as needed

Get Involved

- Find a club, sport or extracurricular activity to get involved in. School can be much more than simply earning credits towards graduation.
 Take advantage of the A+ Program, which incorporates district-approved volunteer work, 95% attendance and a minimum 2.5 GPA



PERMISSION FOR STUDENT TO SELF-ADMINISTER MEDICATION BY AUTO INJECTOR

I hereby certify the following:

1. I ______, am the parent or legal guardian of ______ ("Student"), a student in the Parkway School District ("District"), and am legally authorized to make educational and health care decisions for the Student.

2. I hereby give my permission for the Student to retain in his/her possession an Epi-pen auto injector, and to self-administer medication from such injector. This permission shall be effective during the school day; on school property, including but not limited to a school bus; and at all school activities, whether on or off school property or occurring during the regular school day.

3. I have provided the District with a written medical history of the Student's experience with severe allergy or other potentially life-threatening anaphylaxis ("Condition") and a plan of action for addressing any emergency situations that could reasonably be anticipated as a consequence of administering the medication and having the Condition.

4. I have provided the District with written certification from the Student's physician, stating that the Student (a) has the aforementioned Condition and (b) is capable of, and has been instructed in, the proper method of self-administration of medication and informed of the dangers of permitting other persons to use the medicine prescribed for the Student.

5. I hereby certify the following:

1. I ______, am the parent or legal guardian of ______ ("Student"), a student in the Parkway School District ("District"), and am legally authorized to make educational and health care decisions for the Student.

2. I hereby give my permission for the Student to retain in his/her possession a metered-dose inhaler, and to self-administer medication from such inhaler. This permission shall be effective during the school day; on school property, including but not limited to a school bus; and at all school activities, whether on or off school property or occurring during the regular school day.




