Louis Armstrong was born August 4th, 1901 in a poor section of New Orleans. His father was a factory worker and left the family soon after Louis' birth. Often his mother left him with his grandmother. In fifth grade Armstrong left school and began working for a jewish family, the Karnofskys. He had a job collecting and delivering coal. They encouraged him to sing and often invited him over for dinner. On new year's eve in 1912 Armstrong fired his step fathers gun into the air during a celebration and was arrested. He was sent to a home for boys. There he received musical instruction on the clarinet and fell in love. In 1914 he was released and began his life of music. By the end of his teens Armstrong married a woman named Daisy Parker. During the summers he played on a river boat with a band led by Fate Marable and had many encounters with other jazz legends. Louis Armstrong was a trumpeter, composer, singer, and occasional actor. He wrote and sang songs like hello dolly, when the saints come marching in, and what a wonderful world. He died July 6th 1917 in New York city. He may be gone, but his legacy lives on forever.
