

Introduction to Computer Technology

Welcome to Introduction to Computer Technology, ICT! The purpose of this course is to provide students with an opportunity to develop a strong foundation in computer and information literacy. This course is a broad introduction to the use of computers as tools for creativity, communications and organizing information. Students will learn about online tools, word processing and spreadsheet software, as well as publishing and presentation software. Students will learn how to use computers flexibly, creatively and purposefully. All learners will be able to recognize what they need to accomplish and determine how they can utilize their digital literacy skills and knowledge to best approach the task. (Introduction to Computer Technologies is the recommended beginning course for the Information Technology and Digital Media strands.)


Late Policy
