Cell phone Out of Sight Policy (OSP)

Why?

All freshmen core teachers will be supported with a cell phone **out of sight policy**. The class of 2022 were all issued their own chromebook by the district, therefore, a personal device is no longer necessary for instructional use. In support of our mission, to develop self-directed, creative, critical thinkers who are socially responsible people prepared for an ever-changing world, removing all unnecessary distractions from instructional time will better assure this.

Teachers have full autonomy on how they would like to implement the policy.

Overview

- Students are expected to keep all cellphones out of sight during instructional time in class
- Phones should be silenced and put away where no one can see it. Inside purses, bag, pocket, etc. It can <u>not</u> be in sight
- A two-sided flip sign will be given to each Freshman teacher to post in the classroom as an indicator for students to know the policy is being implemented
 - One side displays a "no cellphone" side
 - The other side displays a "Permissions Granted" for special assignments only

Suggested ways to implement...

- Teachers may house a cell phone locker where they may allow students to turn their phones in at the designated location in the classroom
- Teachers may implement their own collection process at the start of the class
- Teachers may simply have students put their phones away in their own personal belongings as longs as it's out of sight
