



Attendance Guidelines

Student Responsibilities

- ★ Expected to be in school everyday
- ★ Must remain on campus the entire day
 - No going out to the parking lot during school hours
- ★ Late arrivals mush check in with the attendance office
- ★ Students needing to leave early must obtain a early dismissal slip (arranged by parent)

Parent Responsibilities

- ★ Absences are only excused for when a parent/guardian calls the grade level office within 24 hours of the absence
 - This goes for students who may be absent to a specific block due to a doctor's appointment, court, or any emergency situation
- ★ Excused Tardiness do not exist

What constitutes an Excused Absence?

- EXCUSED absences include the following:
 - Illness of the student (In some cases, documentation from appropriate licensed professionals may be required for an excused absence.)
 - Death in the student's immediate family
 - Days of religious observance
 - Medical or dental appointments
 - Court Appearance
 - Quarantine or hospital confinement
 - Medical, mental health/psychological, or substance abuse treatment when documented by appropriate licensed professionals
 - Field trips or other school initiated absences
 - An emergency that, in the judgment of the principal, constitutes a reasonable cause of absence from school

Consequences and Ramifications

Here is a quick review of North's Tardy/Unexcused Absence Policy. The following consequences will be given as students accumulate tardies/unexcused absences during the semester:

- 3rd Tardy/Unexcused Absence Warning
- 5th Tardy/Unexcused Absence After-school detention One Hour
- 7th Tardy/Unexcused Absence After-school detention One Hour
- 9th Tardy/Unexcused Absence and any thereafter After-school detention Three hour
- Problem solving with parents, teachers, counselor and administrator for repeat offenders

Consequences do not start over during the course of a semester
