

- Stay active and involved! Colleges want to admit well rounded students.




College Deadline Types

- **Early Action:** Non-binding application that you submit early (Oct., Nov., Dec.).
- **Early Decision:** Binding agreement that you are agreeing to enroll if you are admitted. If accepted you must contact any other colleges you applied to and withdraw those applications. You can only apply early decision to one school (Oct., Nov., Dec.).
- **Priority Deadline:** Many state and/or public schools use their priority deadline to encourage early applications and most schools use this as a priority deadline for scholarships consideration.
- **Rolling Admission:** Schools with rolling admission deadlines accept applications until the program fill up, often as late as April. (Many rolling admission schools with rolling deadlines will still have set admission deadlines for particular programs (such as medical programs). Applying early is the best with rolling admissions.
- **Regular Decision:** Regular Decision deadlines for fall admission usually occur in the preceding January or February, and students receive a decision by April.



More Admissions Terminology

- Test-Optional: ACT or SAT is not required for admission consideration. Students may provide their scores, but are not required to do so. Students will not be penalized for not having taken the ACT/SAT
- SuperScore: When colleges take the highest section score from multiple ACT/SAT exam dates instead of the highest ACT/SAT composition (total for one test date) to recalculate the total score using multiple test dates.
- Deferred: The decision on your admission will be determined at a later date. It is not "yes" or "no," but that a decision will happen later.
- Waitlisted: This is not used at all colleges. It means that although you were not admitted, you are in the next "group" to be considered.







- Log into <u>Naviance</u>
- Find the college you want to visit and click "more info"
- Click Register!
- A link will be available on Naviance the day of the visit.
- All school rules apply!
- Bring a list of questions!



How do I apply?

- Personal Preference!
 - BUT, if you are only applying to 1-2 schools, the college's direct application will be faster!
- Some schools require an application fee.
 - If you are on free or reduced lunch ask Ms. Meyer for a fee waiver or request this directly on the Common App
- Must Link Common App to Naviance.
- Coalition App does not link, but you can still request transcripts and letters of recommendation through Naviance.
- All materials must be requested through Naviance, NOT Common App or Coalition App!

Institutional Application

- Use College Website
- Follow Directions Completely
- Should only take 15-20 minutes
- Submit App & Fee Online
- Select "Undergraduate" and "Fall 2021."
- Add school to Naviance.
- If free / reduced lunch, request fee waiver from Ms. Meyer.

Common App - 900 Colleges!

- Create Application at <u>CommonApp.org</u>
- Complete the "Common App" section
- Add Colleges and Follow Individual Directions
- Do NOT add teachers in Common App.
- If free / reduced lunch, request fee waiver on Common App.

Tips / Tricks to Applying to College




- Use an email address that you check! Make sure that it has an appropriate username. This is the first thing that colleges will see!
- Be present, but professional on social media. More colleges are checking social media accounts when making admissions decisions.
- Apply not only to your top school, but a safety school! You don't want to miss deadlines because you only applied to one school. I would suggest at least one in state school.
- Add college credits to your application. If you took AP classes, dual credit, or dual enrollment, let the college know!
- Read over your application before submitting. Grammatical / spelling errors never look great. Make sure proper nouns, such as your name and address are all capitalized.
- Show interest in the college that you are applying to. Do your research and tell them why you
 are a good fit for their school. Everyone wants a good education, be specific on why you
 actually like their school or campus! Read out to admissions and talk to their campus rep or
 take a virtual tour!

Requesting Transcripts

- 1. Make sure that you have your <u>Transcript Release Form</u> on File.
- If you are applying through Common App, make sure that you match your account. (Schools will automatically populate into your "Colleges I Am Applying To" on Naviance."
- 3.Request and track through Naviance!
 - Click "Colleges I Am Applying To"
 - Add each school with the pink plus, sign
 - Click Request Transcripts!


Requesting Letters of Recommendation

- How many?
 - Each school has their own requirement for how many letters that you need. Some colleges want 1, 2, 3 or some colleges don't require any! To be safe, you should ask at least 2 core teachers.
- Who to ask?
 - Someone that knows you well! Academically and personally.
- How to ask?
 - Don't be shy! Send them an email or set up a virtual meeting. Follow up with a thank you! Provide them with a resume, list of activities, or fill out the Recommendation Survey in Naviance.
- How must notice should I give?
 - At least 2 weeks! You will get a better letter and it will put less stress on the teacher and you.



How to Request a Letter of Recommendation in Naviance

Step 1. Complete the Recommendation Information Survey in Naviance or Provide a Resume. Both can be completed by going to the "About Me Section" of Naviance. The Resume Builder is really great!
You can only send letters of recommendation to teachers/counselors via Naviance. If you want to ask someone else you need to request it through CommonApp or have them email / mail their letter

You will have the option to send your letters to one college or all of them. You have the option on choosing where some of the letters will go!

How to Request a Letter of Recommendation in Naviance

Step 2. After you have asked your teachers, go to "Colleges I am Applying To" in Naviance and then "Letters of Recommendation." The teacher will receive an email notification with your request.

Naviance Shut Down Dates

The Naviance Transcript Request Manager will shut down during the following time frames. You will not be able to request a transcript during that time. Please plan accordingly so you do not miss your deadline!! Note. you can still request a transcript if you haven't submitted your application yet. If you need a transcript sent during the following windows of time, please make sure you request the transcript prior to the following shut down dates:

- October 23 November 2
- November 23 November 30
- December 18 January 5



Scholarships





Institutional Scholarships

These come directly from the institution. Usually after you have been admitted. Sometimes there are additional forms to fill out or essays to write, so make sure you are checking with the financial aid offices / admissions offices at your chosen schools.

Local Scholarships

These are scholarships that you are not competing against a ton of people. You are typically competing against students in your school or your community. These are usually stackable with other scholarships, so don't let the lower dollar amounts get you discouraged.

National Scholarships

You are competing on a National level. Usually these are for higher amounts. Make sure that you meet all of the qualifications before applying. Never pay for a scholarship application. (Hint: Make a different email account, because they will spam your email with opportunities that are overwhelming!)

<u>Fastweb</u> <u>Scholarships.Com</u> <u>Cappex</u>

A+ Program Sign up until February 1 of Senior Year Everything is due by May 1st!

This program provides scholarship funds to eligible graduates of A+ designated high schools who attend a participating public community college or career/technical school. This is an approximate equivalent of TWO YEARS TUITION.

*Some <u>Missouri 4 year universities</u> will offer scholarship dollars to students that also complete these requirements (this is determined by the college itself and is changing all of the time, contact the college!).

Requirements:

- Be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident.
- Attend an A+ designated high school for 2 years prior to graduation.
- Graduate with an overall 2.5 unweighted grade point average (grades 9-12).
- □ Maintain an overall attendance rate of 95% or higher (9-12).
- Score proficient or advanced on the Algebra I or II EOC OR receive a qualifying score on the Mative DS section of the ACT.
- □ Maintain a record of good citizenship (no more than 9 days of combined ISS/OSS).
- Perform 50 documented hours of unpaid tutoring, mentoring, job shadowing, or community service. More information on the website!
- □ Must complete FAFSA (senior year) and males must register for the Selective Service.

Check out

FAFSA (Opens on October 1st!)

The financial aid process is set in motion when you file the **FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This can be electronically submitted any time after October 1 of your senior year.

1.) Create a FSA ID: fsaid.gov

Student and one parent need to create separate FSA IDs using separate email accounts. The FSA ID is a username and password that serves as your electronic signature when filing for the FAFSA. **DO NOT LOSE THIS INFORMATION.** You will use your FSA ID every year that you are in college when you apply for your FAFSA.

2.) Start your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): fafsa.gov

The student needs to fill out the majority of the FAFSA. There is a parent portion where the parent will fill out their information and tax information. For the Class of 2020, we will be filling out the 2021-22 FAFSA.

What the student / parent will need prior to filling out the FAFSA:

- 1. Student / Parent's Social Security Number
 - If Parent does not have SSN, they may put 000-00-000. Speak to Ms. Meyer regarding this.
- 2. Driver's License Number (if applicable)
- 3. Alien Registration Number (if not US Citizen)
- 4. Federal Tax Information or Tax Returns including W2 Information (2019 Tax Form)
 - Try to use the **IRS Data Retrieval Tool** (if applicable).
- 5. Records of Untaxed Income (Child Support, Interest Income, Veterans Noneducation Benefits, etc.)






