

- → Grade Point Average (GPA): EVERYTHING COUNTS!!!
 - Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) The cumulative GPA is obtained by dividing the total grade points earned by the total credits attempted for a grade of A, B,C or D
 - Your cumulative grade point average updates at semester
 - At the end of 1st semester, if you passed every class, you have earned a total of <u>10.5 credits</u>

Trusted Adults:

- Who is this in the building for you?
 - When is a good time to see this person?
- Where do I go when I get frustrated or overwhelmed?
 - Counselor's office, Principal's office or to your trusted adults classroom
- Academic lab traveling procedures
