### **CULTURAL ARTIFACT ASSIGNMENT**

#### Overview

- 1. Choose a culture that you belong to at this time.
- 2. Select an artifact that explains something about your chosen culture.
- 3. Research your artifact and culture.
- 4. Write an analysis of your chosen culture and artifact.
- 5. Present your artifact to the class and explain what it says about your chosen culture.

The article may provide general background information about your culture or be more specific in nature—focusing on a particular aspect of the culture. Print, read, and annotate the article.

## Script

Write out a single-spaced script of what you plan to say following MLA standards. Your speech should introduce (using a lead-in) at least one direct quotation from your article and properly cite it (both parenthetically and on the Works Cited). In your presentation, you may include an overview or background about your cultural group, how your culture has changed or influenced you as an individual, and what the object represents to you.

You must have a proper MLA header in the upper left-hand corner. However, <u>you may use first-person</u> point of view. A Works Cited with proper MLA citations is also required and should be the last page of the script.

# Presentation

Bring your artifact with you to class on the day of presentations. It must be a physical item and should not be the same as any other student in your section/block, unless permission is given You will give a 2-3 minute presentation to Mrs. Michael, Ms. Campanella, and your peers about your artifact and what we can learn about you and your culture from the object. If helpful, use the statements below to assist you in preparation for your presentation.
