# Homework Policy:

Homework is given on a daily basis and will be posted on the chalkboard at the front of the classroom. In the first five minutes of class, you are expected to copy assignments into your planner. You are responsible for keeping track of homework assignments.\*\*

As the purpose of homework is to reinforce class content and enable informed participation, late homework will **not be accepted.** Rare exceptions may be made at the discretion of the teacher and may require a note from home. If necessary a point deduction may be associated. Parents or guardians will be contacted if you are regularly unprepared. You are encouraged to come in during Academic Lab and/or stay after school for extra help if you need it.

Extensions may be granted under extenuating circumstances, but you must speak with me about the extension before the assignment due date.



### Long Term Assignments (essays, projects, etc..:

Will be accepted late but will lose a letter grade for each day the assignment is late. After one week, the grade is zero.



# Make-up Procedures:

Students are responsible for contacting me concerning make-up work after an excused absence. Students will have the same number of days that they are absent to make up daily work. Any written work, quizzes, or exams must be made up within the allotted time unless other arrangements are made. Please call a classmate or see me when you return for daily homework assignments, class notes, and announcements.

If you have an *EXCUSED* absence on the day a test is given or an essay is due, *IT MUST BE TURNED* IN/MADE UP ON THE DAY YOU RETURN TO SCHOOL UNLESS THERE ARE EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN A ZERO FOR THE ASSIGNMENT!


