Parkway School District Visual Arts Curriculum

Fourth Grade

Elementary art education develops perceptual awareness, visual literacy, creative problem solving, and higher order thinking skills. Barretts students have art classes once every four days for 50 minutes, with a visual arts specialist. School, Regional and All-District art shows provide opportunities for students to display their work.

Fourth grade students will:

- use line to create outlines, shapes, forms, complex patterns and rhythmic movement
- *identify and use tints and shades, primary, secondary and intermediate colors, create basic color schemes, and begin to recognize transparent and opaque colors*
- identify and demonstrate a value scale and create the illusion of form through the use of highlight and shadow
- understand and apply the use of geometric and organic shapes to show distance through overlapping and size variation
- understand and apply the use of space in 2-D and 3-D artwork and use diminishing details to create the illusion of distance
- begin to understand the concepts of 3-D forms, such as relief and sculptures in the round
- use texture as a decorative element in a variety of media and understand invented and actual textures
- create positive and negative space, apply concepts of foreground, middleground and background and use size relationships in artwork
- understand and use design principles, including contrast, proportion, balance, rhythm, and unity within a composition
- understand and demonstrate the use of appropriate techniques in production and apply process knowledge to create art
- *identify, select, and use a variety of tools and materials to create desired outcomes*
- create a fiber weaving using a simple loom, understanding the difference between warp and weft
- understand and follow steps of a process to produce a quality piece of art and take responsibility for revising for enhancement
- use a variety of subject matter, symbols, meaningful images, and visual expression to communicate themes and ideas
- *identify specific works of art and artists from particular cultures and recognize their defining characteristics*
- begin to compare and contrast examples of artwork from different cultures or historical periods
- identify and communicate the connections between the visual arts and other subject areas
- research the influence of culture on the visual arts and create art to reflect the style of different cultures or historical time periods
- describe a work of art with appropriate art vocabulary, demonstrating a knowledge of the elements of art and principles of design
- compare and contrast the use of visual characteristics to communicate ideas and purposes of art
- critique personal work and the work of others
- compare and contrast various types of artwork and media
- *develop the ability to select and transform ideas with multiple artistic solutions*
