Thanks to all that joined us today to honor our Veterans. A big thanks to our Student Lighthouse Team that planned the entire event!

During the next few weeks the grade level administrators and counselors will be visiting teams to discuss bullying in our school with the focus on bystander empowerment. We will help students understand the definition of bullying a well as provide them with some strategies they can use if they witness such behavior. Our school's mission is to make sure West is a community where everyone feels safe. Below are the strategies that we will encourage students to use as a bystander:

- Don't join in the laughing or teasing,
- Tell the person "that is not funny" or "that is not cool",
- Change the conversation,
- Cause a distraction,
- Help the target leave the conversation ex. "Let's get out of here",
- Stand near the target,
- Show empathy to the target afterward ex. "I would feel sad, too" "I'm so sorry this is happening",
- Don't forward or negatively respond to unkind posts,
- Post supportive things about the target,
- Report to a trusting adult

Please talk with your child about these strategies so we can all work together to help our community be a positive and safe one.

CHAD'S Coalition: We are fortunate to partner with a valuable community resource: CHAD's Coalition. The emphasis is on recognizing the signs of depression and A.C.T.ing: Acknowledge, Care, Tell. We encourage our students to talk to parents and trusted adults if they have a concern about themselves or someone else. This program is a collaborative effort of our Counseling Department and PE/Health. Seventh graders participated this past week; 8th graders will participate Monday or Tuesday of the coming week. The most powerful tool of prevention is communication. Please talk with your children about this topic.
