Each school year, all schools are required by the state to submit a Comprehensive School Improvement Plan. The plan includes goals and measurable objectives based on our school's achievement data from the previous school year. We, at West Middle. write the plan to be implemented in a three year cycle. The plan is not only aligned with the district goals, but with West Middle's own mission - to ensure all students find their purpose, place, and voice. We have outlined four major areas for our goals:

- 1. Implementation of the Professional Learning Community Process-providing development for our teachers to be able to work through the process to increase student achievement. The process is based around 5 critical questions. What do we want students to know? How will we know they know it? How will we respond when they already know it? What will we do when they don't know it? What are best practices to ensure all students learn at high levels?
- 2. Implementation of a systematic Character Education Process- This is our Leader in Me (LEAD) process of teaching and demonstrating the learning around the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. This includes West Time and LEAD Time for students to develop leadership skills and so we recognize their worth and potential.
- 3. Continue our work as professionals to increase our understanding around Social Justice. The West Middle Staff engaged in Social Justice Training in the 2015-2016 School year. We will strive to continue to learn and widen our lens to reach all students.
- 4. Increasing student engagement in the classroom to ensure all students learn at high levels. Our staff has had ongoing training in this area with 90 percent of the staff attending a 2 day training using on how to use Kagan Strategies to increase achievement.

We are always striving to improve our work and help all students learn at high levels, while recognizing their worth and potential. If you would like a copy of our Comprehensive Plan please send me an email.

One way we will measure our progress toward implementation of our Leader in Me (LEAD) process is by using a survey tool called *Measurable Results Assessment Survey*. We emailed all stakeholdersparents, teachers, and students to fill out a survey on October 19 and we will send another survey in May.
