

We're very proud of how the entire school embraced yesterday's initial Intruder Drill with a serious but sincere, "this is why we practice" attitude. We were eager to use the new language of our kid-friendly, color-coded Emergency Response system, expertly taught by our teachers. As you may have heard at the PTO meeting Wednesday, Dr. Piccinni initiated the drill via the PA system by first explaining what students would hear: her voice announcing "Security Alert: Code Red," Dr. Piccinni and Mrs. Lackey jiggling door handles as we checked



the locks throughout the building, then Dr. Piccinni announcing the "Code Green: All Clear" when we were finished.

In true Pierremont fashion, embracing new learning and new challenges, we initiated the drill despite recesses and transitions that were happening at the time. Students and staff were amazing. Perhaps you've heard the stories... Our first graders, who were at recess, listened closely to directions and followed their teachers toward the Rally Point near the front playground. Our Academy students, who were at recess in the back, headed toward the Rally point beyond the back playground. Our superstar third graders, along with their quick-thinking teachers, were actually at various points of transition to specials. In true 4E training style, the adults thought on their feet and either led a group to a Rally Point or ducked into a nearby classroom to "evade." Teachers were teammates, helping students not necessarily their "own" and handling the whole situation with the calm, caring stance typical of our staff. What a great first intruder drill!

Extra special thanks to our outdoor groups (1st, 3rd, Academy, P.E....) who gave an extra ounce of grace (along with a bit of humor later on) to me. If you haven't heard, an in-the-moment addition to our practice was to echo the "Code Red" over the walkie-talkie for any outside groups. Good idea, huh? Well, when the "Code Green" was announced on the PA, I was mid-follow-up with a few teachers in the building and *completely* forgot to echo or announce the "Code Green: All Clear" on the walkie-talkie. Ahhh! Needless to say, our outside friends got about ten extra minutes at the Rally Points on a beautiful day...Thanks for the reminder, Mrs. Wallace! See kiddos, even grown-ups need practice when something is new. And they always jump in and help each other.
