Dear Parents and Guardians,

How should we measure time? In Italy, during the seventeenth century, Galileo used a clock, which started at sundown and kept the hours from one to twenty-four. The advantage over the sundial was that it marked time through the dark hours and when it rained. It also sounded the hour for people to hear.

In contrast, the clock time in the book by J. K. Rowling, referred to people and where they were at a specific time (i.e., traveling home, at school learning, eating dinner, etc.). Perhaps that type of timekeeping would be more meaningful and more real.

At Henry, time is also measured by the good character seen, students' academic progress, and the stories or subtle happenings that show the growth of each child. It is time that reaches the heart:

At lunch, a student was quietly sitting by himself. All the other seats were taken at the other tables. Two students noticed. They picked up their lunches and joined him so he wouldn't feel left out.

A third-grade student shared that he had noticed that there were new students at our school. He asked if he could introduce himself to them and then help others get to know them. He knew what it felt like to be new.

A student approached a staff member and asked if she could show what the teacher wrote. She showed the recognition card that was posted on the wall. It reflected the 7 Habits of good character. The child said, "I didn't even know my teacher saw how I was working hard. I know I have matured this year. It's going to be a really good year!"

Good years, wonderful moments, caring and successes are what matters in a school and our world. Maybe it is time for a patent that really marks things that matter as we travel through life... Thanks for being at Henry and helping us "mark time."

CELL PHONES/ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are not to use or have cell phones during school hours. If students bring them to school, they must be kept in the child's backpack, or they may be kept by the teacher and returned to the student at the end of the day.

There is a telephone in each classroom that can be used for emergencies.

EMERGENCY DISMISSAL

At some time during the school year it may become necessary for Parkway schools to have an early dismissal due to inclement weather conditions, or it may be necessary for only Henry School to be closed for the day or to have classes dismissed early due to some type of emergency. *You and your children are to develop a plan for these situations*. This is for the safety of your children.

- · Parents should receive a recorded message in the case of a school closure or early dismissal.
- When school is closed for the day or dismissed early, all after-school and evening activities are automatically canceled. This will also include the Adventure Club.
- Please note that although school may be dismissed early, children may not arrive home early. Traffic tie-ups may prevent the buses from getting through their routes on time. Children may arrive home ahead of schedule or arrive home very late.
- It is important that families have a plan and that children know exactly what to do when normal schedules are disrupted.
- It is also important that children are dressed properly to guard against exposure to weather.

VISITOR CHECK-IN SYSTEM

Who is visiting our schools?

We take our responsibility to keep students and staff safe seriously, which is why we must know who is in our school buildings during the school day.

In the interest of safety, Parkway's visitor check-in system is in all schools and buildings.

All parents, visitors, guests, contractors and volunteers will need to show photo identification when they check in at a school or building. Guests will receive a printed visitor badge with their name on it to wear while they are in a school during school hours. This also allows us to check visitors against the sex offender registry.

All other dates are in the information packet that went home.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE

To ensure the safety of all students, we ask that you review the district discipline policy with your children. The policy can be found on the district website. Students are expected to be on their best behavior at the bus stop, on the bus, walking to and from school, and at school.

<u>Please remember that no weapons, toy weapons, or</u> <u>scout knives are to be brought to school at any time.</u> Please review the discipline information which is sent to your home by the district. **Safety is a priority in Parkway.**

SCHOOL DRESS GUIDELINES

Children are encouraged to value neatness and cleanliness. Appropriate and comfortable clothing will help the students participate fully in all school activities. Children who are dressed inappropriately will be sent to the office and parents will be contacted.

- Children should not wear spaghetti straps, low cut shirts or tops, or those showing the midriff.
- Tight shorts or short shorts or other distracting clothing are also not permitted.
- Pants are to be worn on the waist and not slung low.
- Clothing advertising alcohol, drugs, tobacco, or logos and messages inappropriate for a school setting should not be worn.
- Tennis shoes and socks should be worn for physical education classes and for recess and playground activities. Flip-flops, open sandals, clogs, or high-heeled shoes should not be worn at school due to the nature of recess and PE activities.
- Outer clothing appropriate for the weather will be necessary since recess is outdoors whenever possible.
- · Henry is an air-conditioned building.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance and punctuality are a must if a child is to gain the utmost from his/her educational experience. It establishes a lifelong pattern which is beneficial. We urge you to have your child attend school with as few absences and tardiness as possible.

If a student arrives at school after 9:05 a.m., a parent should accompany the child to the office.

A parent signature and reason for late arrival is required on the Student Sign-In Sheet.

Thank you for helping us take care of your children.

MESSAGES FOR STUDENTS

We ask that you make all after-school plans with your children before sending them to school. However, if you need to get a message to your child, or change the instructions for going home, *please call the office before 3:00p.m.* We will then have your child come to the office to pick up your important message.

RELEASING STUDENTS

It is sometimes necessary to release students for appointments and family emergencies.

A note explaining the reason and time for release should be signed by the parent and given to the classroom teacher.

Parents picking up children must come to the office and sign out their child. For the safety of your child, students will be dismissed only through the office. Teachers are instructed not to release students from the classroom or playground. We can only release children to the parents/guardians listed on the *Family Profile* forms. If someone who is not on the *Family Profile List* should need to pick up your child, you will need to contact the office in advance and provide written permission. They will then need to come into the office and show a valid photo ID (drivers license) so we can make sure the student is going with the person you sent to pick them up. They will also need to sign the student out.

ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

The U.S. EPA Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) under the Federal Code of Regulations 40 CFR 763.93g(4) requires that building occupants be notified annually of the presence of asbestos in the building and the availability of the Asbestos Management Plan. The Management Plan identifies the types and locations of asbestos building, in the and identifies inspections, sampling data, and response actions taken by the District.
