Reports of Standing Committees:

Pre-Sold School Supplies: Stephanie Alport wants the school to decide if it wants to include the non-educational items in the school supply list for pre-sold school supplies or remove those items from the list. Eliminating the non-educational items would make purchasing the packages cheaper. Families could purchase the non-educational supplies cheaper elsewhere.

Officer Reports

President's Report:

New Business

Panther Caring for Families: Debbie Palozzola and Jo Schulman reported that a new program has been started at the school called Caring Panther Kindness. This program is for families at the school who are in need. Administration and the school counselors chose 4 families within the school. Mittens will be hanging in the school and if families want to participate, they can take a mitten and purchase the item on the mitten. Another way to donate would be to send in cash, which will go towards grocery gift cards for the families. Look for the flyers coming soon.

Debbie Palozzola reported a salad bar will be added to the cafeteria. Students will be able to use it in a couple weeks. The school's food service has very limited space in the cafeteria. The workers have been pulling their work space back trying to make room for students. The YMCA and Boy Scouts have cabinets in the cafeteria that are taking up space the school desperately needs. The school is looking into building permanent cabinets on the stage area in the cafeteria. This would open up floor space for the children in the cafeteria. Placing the cabinets up on the stage would mean the mural in the cafeteria would no longer be there. The names on the mural will be honored

a different way such as maybe using a plaque. Administration understands the mural was a fundraiser and they are discussing options as to how they can still honor those people who have their names on the mural. For future fundraisers, the school would like to place murals like this on a canvas. This would allow when the mural to be moved around the school as needed.

Principal's Report: Carrie Luttrell reported she was able to go around to the children's classrooms for the Fall parties. She was impressed with how well the parties all went and enjoyed watching the kids have fun. The siblings that did come were fabulous. She is very appreciative of everyone's work to make the Fall Party happen for the children.

Carrie was happy to report that dismissal has been going great with the new dismissal plan. The safety aspect for the children has greatly improved and Carrie has been able to catch a few situations before the situation happened.

The school was going to add an addition on to the back of the school for the music and strings room. Several hundred thousands of dollars would have been spent on this addition. She reported the district needs to tighten its belt and after looking at things that need to be done at the school, the addition won't be built. As for the strings room, the school will increase the floor space in the strings room by providing built in instrument storage. A staff bathroom will be built. A permanent special educational room will be built for Mrs. Welch in the fifth grade area pod. This way, the children will remain with the older children in the school. The school will create two nice size permanent classrooms by using the computer lab and math intervention room by removing the wall and dividing it in half creating a permanent math intervention room and a permanent mosaic room. The office area where it currently is at will have some walls knocked out increasing a direct line of sight vision to the front doors. Professionally permanent secretary workstations will be will be built. A print room and Assistant Principal Office will also be built along with so much more. All of this can be done for far less money than adding on an addition to the school. Once the final draft of the blue print is done, it will be available for the community to look at. All projects will be done this summer.

The crisis plan and crisis manual are being updated. The school is asking parents to make sure that Diane Pretak has all emergency contacts noted on the pickup list.
