## **Shenandoah Valley Elementary Talent Show Rules**

- 1. Participation in the talent show is for SVE students only.
- 2. Each student can participate in only one act (solo or group).
- 3. Students may express any talent as long as it is deemed appropriate and safe by the Talent Show Committee.
- 4. All performances will have a time limit of 2 minutes or less.
- 5. Students must be able to attend an audition on Thursday, February 21, 2019 between 4:30-7:30pm and a final dress rehearsal on Monday, March 25, 2019 between 4:30-7:00pm in order to perform in the talent show. A parent/guardian/adult caregiver must be present during the audition, rehearsal, and talent show.
- 6. Song lyrics, costumes/attire, and performances need to be school-appropriate and comply with Parkway School District's Standards of Conduct. Students must follow school rules while auditioning, rehearsing, and performing in the show.
- 7. For singing acts, lip syncing and/or singing along to recorded vocals will not be allowed. Students will need to have a karaoke version of the song they want to sing.
- 8. Students who are using music as part of their performance will be responsible for providing a recorded copy of the song (on a CD or flash drive) and printed lyrics to the Talent Show Committee during the initial audition. This applies to all performers using music, whether they are singing to music, dancing to music, or using background music during their performance. Students should Google their song lyrics and make sure they match the recorded version of the song they are using. The Talent Show Committee will make a copy of the music and return the student's CD or flash drive at the audition.
- 9. Parents/guardians will need to preview their child's act, approve of the content, and provide written permission for their child/children to participate in the talent show.
- 10. All decisions made by the Talent Show Committee are final.
