## **CRAFT SCHOLARSHIPS**

A minimum of 9 craft scholarships will be awarded yearly in the amount of \$3,000, renewable for up to two years.

**Selection Criteria:** Award based primarily on personal interview and/or job shadow, however academics (minimum ACT of 18, minimum GPA of 2.50), career aspirations, volunteer work, leadership skills and financial need will also be taken into consideration.

Scholarship administration and selection is performed by the Ellis Foundation.

## **Eligibility requirements:**

- Must be a resident of Kansas or Missouri attending a Kansas or Missouri high school
- · Must be an upcoming graduating high school senior
- Must be pursuing a degree in electric power and distribution, power plant technology, wind or renewable energy, industrial technology or other industry-related degrees
- Must be eligible to obtain a Commercial Drivers License (line worker scholarship only)
- Must enroll and maintain a full-time status in your degree program to receive scholarship award
- Must maintain a 2.5 GPA in your degree program
- If 18, must be willing to submit to a Motor Vehicle Record Check (drug free with no DUI convictions)
- Females and minorities are urged to apply

#### Selection process:

- Submit 2 completed applications by March 1, 2020 (One for Evergy and one for the Ellis Foundation. Information for the Ellis application will be sent to you upon completion of your first application.)
- Participate in a personal interview on one of the following dates: March 16–20
  (Stephanie Homolka will call to schedule)
- Attend a mandatory one-day Lineman Prep Day (Date to-be-determined for a Saturday in April–June after the scholarship is awarded)
- The location for Lineman Prep Day will be in Topeka, Wichita or Kansas City, MO

## **Power Plant Operator/Wind Energy Technician Scholarships**
