Strategic Prevention Framework

Assessment

The *ongoing process* of detailing

1. Community needs
2. Community dynamics
3. Community response capacity

Using quantitative and qualitative data.



Strategic Prevention Framework "SPF"

Assessment: Profiling

1. Needs

- a. Incidence rates
- b. Root causes (causal factors or I.V.s)

2. Community Dynamics Demographics

- a. History
- b. Cohesion
- c. Priorities
- d. Readiness



Strategic Prevention Framework

Assessment: Profiling

3. Response Capacity

- a. Resources
 - i. Social capital: community networks, partnerships, and key influencers
 - ii. Knowledge and skills
 - iii. Tools and equipment



Strategic Prevention Framework

Capacity

1. Building and Mobilizing Necessary Resources

- a. Funding: \$\$ and in-kind
- b. Recruitment
 - i. Social capital: community networks, partnerships, and key influencers
 - ii. Knowledge, skills and in-kind

2. Develop Knowledge and Skills About

- a. Identified community challenges
- b. Best practices for effecting community level change



Strategic Prevention Framework

Capacity (cont.)

3. Supplies and Equipment
 - a. Community volunteers
 - b. Space
 - c. Communications access

- 1. Two Primary capacity building strategies**
 - a. Recruitment**
 - b. Training**
