Substance Abuse and Sexual Violence Prevention: Ms. Christina Meneses, Education Supervisor in the metro St. Louis YWCA Women's Resource Center, presented an information packed

overview of the Womens' Resource Center and important aspects of sexual violence and sexual violence prevention. Ms. Meneses detailed the crisis services (24 hr. hotline 314-531-7273), available free of charge to rape and abuse victims, including hospital advocacy and survivor support.

Several points, among many, made by Ms. Meneses in her presentation-

- Alcohol and drug involvement in sexual assault typically result in more blame on the victim and less blame on the perpetrator
- Alcohol and drug abuse are often used as coping mechanisms by victims of sexual assault and other traumas
- Alcohol and drug abuse lower inhibitions in perpetrators and weaken defenses in victims



- Community Champion Recognition: Earl Barge was presented with AHC's Community Champion in recognition of his years of service to multiple community coalitions targeting youth substance abuse.

Earl's presentation highlighted trends in (a) the "politics vs. science" of marijuana legalization, (b) the impacts on brain development, (c) trends in increasing rates of youth use in state wherein legalization has occurred and (d) issues pertaining to the dramatic increases in the potency of modern marijuana as well as the "edible" products increasingly available.
