3:40 **Substance Abuse, Internet Porn and Adolescence** Stephanie Ehmke, L.P.C. provided an excellent presentation that detailed the important similarities in substance abuse and internet pornography involvement. Among the important points made: Because the underlying neurology of various addictions manipulates similar dopamine pathways, internet porn addiction, a.k.a. arousal addiction, is a significant risk for adolescents, especially when involvement with pornography and substance abuse co-occurs over prolonged time periods. Among important points made: (1) Assessment is an *ongoing process* of gathering data that enables AHC to adequately understand the community it serves and targeted health challenges as these challenges are expressed within our community. (2) Partner recruitment is the primary means of capacity building for AHC's work.
