Rev. Madi's ppt. is available on AHC's website- ahc-stl.org. Here are some of the salient points he raised:
 - Clergy are often called upon as "first responders" in the lives of the people they serve.
 - Many clergy members are overwhelmed and undertrained with regard to behavioral health needs.
 - There is considerable evidence that a meaningful spiritual life has both preventative and restorative value regarding behavioral health.
 - In seeking to partner with clergy, it will be important that AHC seek collaboration around "common enemies" (addiction, disease, overdose, suicide) and "common goals" (intervention, recovery, prevention)
