**Guest Speaker:** Michael Bertz, Citizens for the Parkway Community, on the Proposition S Bond Issue on the November 6 ballot

- Buildings are old; Parkway needs to update and maintain them
- The bond issue is part of an ongoing plan
- Three reasons for the bond issue:
  - Protecting our investment in facilities, education, and property values
  - Securing our future, using security systems, shatterproof film on glass windows and doors, and instructional technology
  - Delivering Parkway's promise
    - The community was part of defining priorities
    - Parkway is a good financial steward, rated AAA in the state
- The issue is about facilities, not salaries
- The bond issue will not increase your taxes
- It will fund capital improvements for the next 4 years
- Parkway has a tax rate in the bottom quartile in the state
- Michael urged us to vote Yes on November 6<sup>th</sup>, to register to vote and tell friends.
- Yard signs will be available, and volunteers will go out to remind folks to vote.
- 57% majority needed
- The PTO page has links and information on the issue
- Questions addressed:
  - O What if it doesn't pass?

- Parkway would have a \$25 million hole in the budget, 10% of the regular budget, so projects would be delayed and budgets would be cut
- Is it more than the bond issue we passed in 2014? Should we be worried about the increase?
  - Yes, it is larger. But maintenance costs have been rising. And Parkway's debt would be 3.6% of base, which is still conservative. We are allowed 15%.
- O Will there be another bond issue in 4 years?
  - Probably, in 4 to 6 years.
- O What about redistricting instead of expanding crowded schools?
  - That can be traumatic for the community, and the areas that have more children change over time. People also move to particular districts for the schools, such as Blue Ribbon Schools.
- West Middle gained from the last bond issue
  - Renovated/re-sized science rooms
  - Added a health classroom
  - Added instructional spaces for special education and other programs

- Conferences are coming up
- Sixth grade mixer is 10/19, planned by students. The theme is The City, and Math 6 students worked on it
- We are applying to be named a school of character in December

- We have ~\$27,000 in the bank
- Basically in good shape for this point in the year

### New Business: Jenn Gibbs

- Fundraising: We wanted to increase our amount raised because the PTO's balance has been going down the past few years.
- Top Golf fundraiser idea:
  - o For whole families, not just parents
  - o Top Golf requires 50% upfront

- O What is the level of interest, considering these details?
  - Cost \$34/person. Includes soda, coffee, tea; cash bar
  - We would have a raffle, too.
  - They could run 2 tournaments, 1 for adults and 1 for children. They cost an extra \$10/person.
  - Ticket price would be \$65-\$75 per person to raise money.
- After discussion, the group concluded this would be too expensive for most families to choose to come.
- Other fundraising ideas: The group discussed trivia nights and casino/Monte Carlo nights. Many locations may be booked already in the spring. Members will look into these ideas.
