## Behavior Management

McKelvey has a school-wide code of conduct which is part of our daily curriculum and expected at all times. We expect students to be caring, respectful, responsible, and self-motivated.

Our goal is to minimize student disruptions using positive reinforcement. In our classroom, this is most often done through a web-based program called Class Dojo. where students are awarded Dojo points for positive behaviors. Students love tracking their points and I believe this is an excellent communication tool to help keep you updated about your child's behavior. By creating an account on classdojo.com, all parents can have instant access to this information and check their child's progress daily. There's even an app for you! :)

I love catching students doing the right thing. Students can earn rewards together as a class or individually in the following ways...

- **Braggin' Dragons-** Please keep an eye out for these, as they are given when your child goes above and beyond McKelvey or classroom expectations!
- Class Leadership Points- As a class, whenever they receive a compliment from another teacher, or me, they will put a tally under our leadership points on the board. Once a class-decided number of tallies is earned, we will vote on our celebration as class.
- DOJO Points- Each individual student can earn points for positive behaviors such as being kind, remaining on task, helping others, etc. Students can also lose points for skills they need to work on such as being off task, not following directions, being disrespectful to others, etc.

In order to maintain a safe and caring classroom environment, students who demonstrate poor choices will be issued logical consequences. One example of a consequence is the loss of Dojo points. Immediate feedback will be provided to you through the Class Dojo website if this happens.

If a student loses a total of 5 or more Dojo points throughout the week, the student may lose the privilege of "Code of Conduct Friday", where the students celebrate their hard work with extra recess, Chromebook time, or a movie.

Other consequences may include loss of recess time, a Think Sheet, a McKelvey Incident Report (MIR), and in very serious cases, an office referral.

Parent/Teacher communication is vital to student success. Please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns.

Snacks and Birthday Treats

I encourage your child to bring a *nutritious* snack to school each day. We will usually take a short break in the morning. A few recommendations for snacks include fresh fruits, veggies, cheese/crackers, pretzels, or dried fruit. Your child may also bring a water bottle to school. Please make sure the bottle is able to close securely to help limit spills. It is also helpful if you label it with their name in case it gets lost.

On occasion we will have special treats. Parkway has adopted a new food policy, and we are <u>no</u> longer allowed to celebrate birthdays with food due to allergies and sanitation concerns (see Parkway Food Policy below for more information.)Your child may bring a non-food item to share (i.e. pencil). If you are planning a birthday party outside of school, and are only inviting some of the children, please do <u>not</u> send invitations to school. Feelings can get hurt. If you are inviting the whole class, I will gladly place them in mailboxes for you.

#### Parkway Food Policy

#### School-Wide Food Safety Expectations

In order to help protect the health and safety of our students with life-threatening food allergies and to contribute to the health and academic success of all students, the Parkway School District has adopted new district-wide Food Safety Expectations. Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, all schools will promote these best practice guidelines. Classrooms should be food-free whenever possible. Consumption of food in the classroom is strongly discouraged due to allergy and sanitation concerns. Students may continue to bring a snack for their own consumption, especially students with an individual health plan. Students are encouraged to bring healthy snacks to promote health and wellness. Parents may be advised to send in snacks without a particular allergen, if needed, to prevent cross-contamination, which could impact safety for food allergic students. Careful cleaning of surfaces with soap and water after consumption of food is essential. Food may not be brought from home for sharing class-wide. The school nurse will be informed and consulted to identify students with known food allergies. Teachers will make alternative lesson or curricular plans if students with known food allergies could be adversely impacted. Find safe and inclusive ways to celebrate without food. To maintain healthy learners, the safest celebrations occur without food. Birthday celebrations at school and holiday celebrations at school will not include food. Schools are encouraged to be creative in celebrating without food.

#### <u>Assignment Books</u>

This year your child will be responsible for writing down their homework and other important reminders in their school assignment book (planner). Please make sure you check and sign your child's assignment notebook *EVERY NIGHT*. The assignment book (planner) is a great tool for communicating back and forth, and <u>I will check the student's assignment books every day</u>.

#### <u>Home Folder</u>

Your child will receive a homework folder that will come home each night. In this folder you will see the right side is for homework and the left side is papers that are graded or flyers from school and can be left at home. <u>Please clean the papers out on a daily basis</u>. Remember to praise your child for work well done and for the effort they are putting forth.

#### <u>Homework</u>

The third grade team has developed a homework schedule. The students will have reading homework on Mondays and Wednesdays and math homework on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Sometimes we may work on a project at school that requires additional help at home. You will have plenty of advance notice concerning these projects. Homework will be written in the planner everynight. If a student fails to bring their homework to school, they will then be asked to complete it during their recess time. If your child continually chooses to not turn in his/her homework, I will notify you to discuss the situation. Most homework should take no longer than 30 minutes. If your child is really struggling and does not seem to understand a concept, please either email me, or attach a note and send it back to school with the work. The students are given time throughout the day to get started on their homework. If they complete their homework in class, I tell them to still take it home and show it to you. In addition to nightly assignments, your child should read and practice their math facts throughout the week.

#### **Communication**

Parent/teacher communication is essential for a student's success. In order to keep you up to date, I will send a monthly third grade newsletter in their Home folder, and I also will send out "Weekly Reminder" through email. This email will have information about what to expect in your child's Home Folder, and other information about past or upcoming weeks. Please feel free to call me (314-415-4531), email me (abrotherton@parkwayschools.net), or send me a note if you have any questions or concerns. (Please call before or after school, so we can get the most out of our learning day!) In the event of an emergency or change in your child's dismissal plans, please email or call me before 2:30. If you have not received a reply from me by 2:30 please follow up with a phone call to the office to ensure your child gets home safely. We ask that changes to transportation after 2:30 are not mode unless it is an absolute emergency.

#### <u>Absences</u>

If you know that your child is going to be absent please make sure you notify the school (314-415-6525). You must go to the front office and sign your child out before he or she can be dismissed from the classroom. The office will call your child to be dismissed. Students that are tardy must sign in at the office before coming to class. All students should be in their classrooms by 9:00 am and ready to learn. Our days are very busy and we get started right away. If your child is going home on a different bus please send a note to me with the bus number that he or she will be going home. This is very important because I have to write a note to the bus driver.

#### <u>Technology</u>

Each student will be assigned a Chromebook this school year. A chromebook is a laptop that runs Chrome OS as the operating system. This means they can access their google login anytime from any device that has Chrome. They will use it in all curricular areas. Students will spend 30 minutes a week practicing typing skills using the program, Typing Agent. They will type their writing pieces using Google apps, such as Docs and Drawings. Students will be taught the expectations of treating their technology with respect, and will lose their Chromebook if they have issues doing so. Chromebooks will stay at school in 3rd grade.

# Toys/Electronics

Please do <u>not</u> send toys or electronics to school with your child. They can become a problem inside/outside of the classroom, and they can be lost, stolen or broken. There may be exceptions to this rule at times, and a letter will be sent home indicating if/when they are allowed. You and your child accept all responsibility for any toy or electronic that is brought to school. Toy guns or other violence related toys/electronics are never allowed to be brought to school.

If you have intentions of helping with parties or field trips throughout the year, please email me to let me know. We can always use an extra set of hands during these times. *A background check must be completed prior to these events.* Please contact the office for more information on background checks.
