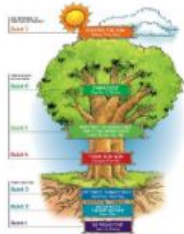
Dear Bellerive Families,

7 Habits Tree

This month, during our life start lessons, students spent time learning about and/or reading the 7 Habits Tree. The Tree is a focal point in our school, using the analogy of a mature tree to illustrate the habits to live life (L.M. website). The Tree is posted in all classrooms, on walls, and each child has a copy in their Leadership Binder. The Tree shows all of the habits and helps you to learn self-discipline. The Private Victory (habits 1, 2, 3) helps individual and helps you to learn self-discipline. The Public Victory (habits 4, 5, 6) helps effective relationships and learn to work well with others. Habit 7 is at the top of the tree, a reminder to take care of yourself.
