- Bellerive School is located in Creve Coeur, Missouri, a western suburb of St. Louis.
- Approximately 375 students are enrolled at Bellerive, in grades K-5.







Home / School Connection Habit #I - Be Proactive

October 2, 2013

Dear Families,

Today your child spent time learning about Habit #H - Be Proactive. In the first story from the book, The 7 Habits of Happy Kids, students learned about Sammy Squirrel. Sammy's story is called "Bored, Bored, Bored" because Sammy is bored and relying on others to find something flun for him to do. At the end of the story Sammy realizes that he sin charge of himself, his choices, and his actions. He decides what he can do, he takes charge, and he makes his own flun! In addition to being in charge, Habit #H - Be Proactive, is about making choices. You can choose your mood and what kind of weather you will have - deciding to have a sunny, happy day or a cloudy, sad/crummy day. The choice is yours!



Habit #H - Be Proactive is also about taking responsibility for your own actions and attitudes. Bellerive students and staff participated in Family Time learning activities today where each child had the opportunity to make a stoplight bookmark and a weather wheel. People who are proactive use the stoplight model to make choices when faced with a frustrating situation. The stoplight stands for:

- STOP (red) Stop to cool down
- THINK (yellow) Think about the different choices you have, choose the best alternative
- 60 (green) It is safe now, act on your best choice; a proactive choice.

Your child is bringing home two additional stoplight bookmarks for you to make and use as a family. These bookmarks can be used to mark a place in your book or you can hang them in prominent places in your home to serve as a reminder to follow **Habit #I - Be Proactive**.

Likewise, the weather wheel is a tool for students to use when thinking about their mood or day. Proactive people choose to have sunny weather, even in the darkest of days. Carrying your weather is a choice, and YOU are the only one who can decide if you will have a "sunny day" or a "cloudy day." Here is a link to a video of Stephen R. Covey, author of <u>The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People</u>, explaining what it means to "carry your weather." It is less than 2 minutes long, yet it is extremely powerful.




Crafts & Activities














Next Steps
